

Dress Code

At KIDS students are expected to adhere to the dress code guidelines in the Northside Elementary Student-Parent Handbook.

Parent Involvement

While your child is attending KIDS, it is recommended that parents work with their children on learning activities at home. Parents are strongly encouraged to take part in the Northside Parent Power Program as well as other parent support programs.

Transportation

1. The address for pick up/drop off must be a residence or child-care facility within NISD boundaries.
2. An adult, who is listed on the transportation form, must be in view at the time of pick up and drop off.
3. A parent or guardian must call transportation at (210) 397-0870 before 6:30 a.m., if the student will not be riding the bus.
4. Students will sit in assigned seats and remain in their assigned seats at all times while on the bus.
5. Students will keep their hands, feet and head inside the bus at all times.
6. Students will not talk to other students, eat or drink while on the bus.
7. Transportation will be discontinued the second time a student is returned to KIDS because no listed adult is present at drop off.
8. If, on more than one occasion, the bus arrives to pick up student and child does not board, transportation will be cancelled.

PROGRAM PURPOSE:

The purpose of the **Kinder Instructional and Developmental Success Program (KIDS)** is to provide a positive educational setting that is developmentally appropriate for Northside Elementary Kinder students. Students recommended for this program are having a difficult time being successful at their home campus. The KIDS program works in collaboration with the home campus to insure the best possible outcome for the student.

The KIDS classroom will follow the NISD Academic Standards, offering a small and highly structured educational setting. In addition, the children will practice appropriate social skills while receiving empathy training, emotion management, and problem solving strategies.

A parent component is a part of the KIDS program. Here parents will work with the teacher to transfer skills from the classroom to home.

Expectations:

- Students are expected to meet all program expectations.
- In order for the student to be successful, parents and school personnel must work collaboratively in the best interest of the student.
- Parents are responsible for discussing with their child and signing the daily report form. The student is responsible for returning it to the teacher.
- Students are responsible for textbooks and other school property.
- When a child is absent or tardy to KIDS, the parent or guardian should send a note explaining the reason for the absence upon the child's return to KIDS. Attendance is important for successful progression through the program.

Expectations:

Students are expected to follow all program rules and regulations. Failure to follow the rules and regulations may result in disciplinary action.

The staff at KIDS realizes the importance of parental involvement with their student's educational progress. Through daily reports, and regular phone calls home, we are continuously striving to work with the student's family in planning for a successful return to school.
