Emergency Kit Procedures Form: Insect Sting or Allergy**

The Northside Independent School District will allow the school nurse, if she is on campus, to administer emergency injections to the student involved if there is a known hypersensitivity and the emergency kit is on campus. The child may give his/her own injection, in the absence of the nurse, if the student has been taught.

Other campus personnel, previously identified as capable of giving injections, will give the emergency injection if the nurse is absent and the child cannot give it to him/her self.

The school nurse, or other personnel, **cannot** observe a child for symptoms and then make his/her own decisions whether to give or withhold oral or injectable medications. The designated person will give the medication immediately upon report of the sting and at such time **30 minutes** immediately after as prescribed.

The Northside Independent School District can give the emergency medications, as outlined above, if the following form is completed by the child's physician.

**Must be filled out and signed by physician and parent/guardian.**

The following steps will be followed in order:

Give injection of epinephrine (dose) \_\_\_\_\_

Medication and dose

1. Call **parent/guardian** or **EMS**.
2. Remove stinger if present.
3. Use ice pack over site.
4. Make arrangements to have student transported to emergency room or doctor's office.
5. Give second dose of epinephrine after 30 minutes if child is still on campus.
