

## Viewing Benchmark Results in CMS

### To view benchmark results by blocks

Go to **Align** > Click on **Analyze Sections** button at top > Choose teacher's name and Course/Section .

In the **Standards Mastery** tab > in **Test Level**, put grade level > in **Test Standard Name**, put **TEKS** unless you are a math teacher (then put **2005 Math**) > in **Test Name** find the benchmark date/name/etc. > in **View Master By** put **TEKS** unless you are a math teacher (it defaults to **2005 Math**).

Scroll down and it shows how many Met Standard Zone 1, Zone 2, Zone 3, and Zone 4. Click on the numbers to see the student names.

The next tab is **Skills Analysis**. Look at the two radio buttons under Test Name. You may choose **Points Achieved** or **Percentage Correct** to get a list of names with results.

The next tab is **Item Analysis**. **\*\*This is an extremely important tab\*\*** You see each student and exactly what questions he/she missed. You may click on the question number at the top and see the benchmark question. The summary shows how many students answered the question correctly in that block. You can scroll all the way to the top and Create PDF to get a printer-friendly version of this page (it takes a while for the PDF to be created—be patient).

**Student List** just gives you a list of students in that block.

**Student Analysis** lets you further filter the block of students by Attendance, TAKS results, etc.

### Looking at overall Benchmark results in Account

Go to **Account** > click on **Benchmark Test Performance** > Make appropriate selections > Again, if you teach anything other than math, select **TEKS** in **Test Standard**; if you teach math, select **2005 Math**. Language Arts teachers—in Subject > select English Language Arts and Reading (not Language Arts) > click Run Report. **Click on one of the numbers in a Met Standard Zone area. Click on Go to Spreadsheet to see student names.**

You get overall results (not by teacher).

**If you are a classroom teacher, you will see only your student names when you click on the numbers in each of the Met Standard Zone areas. If you have campus-wide access, you will see all students.**
