

# Greek or Roman Myths (non-fiction)

## Reading/Writing Connection

\_\_\_\_\_ Complete the INVESTIGATION REPORTING handout for one of the myths in your book. You will give the title and editor (instead of author) of the book, and at the bottom of the page write the title of the myth you are using.

\_\_\_\_\_ Create a board game about one of the myths. Write directions for the game and make the board and the game playing cards. Play the game yourself to be sure it works the way you want it to work.

\_\_\_\_\_ Name one character who changes in this story. Complete the CHANGE...PEOPLE CHANGE handout about this character.

\_\_\_\_\_ Create a *hand poem* of the main character in one of the myths. Trace your hand on drawing paper. Write the character's name on the hand and write 1 thing about that character on each of the five fingers.

\_\_\_\_\_ Complete the CHARACTER GRID handout about a character in this book.

## Technology Connection

\_\_\_\_\_ Using Inspiration, create a story map of 3 of the myths in your book which includes information about the story elements: setting, characters, problem, and resolution. Use color and graphics to make it interesting.

\_\_\_\_\_ Using KidPix or Publisher, create 2 bookmarks for 2 myths in this book. Include the title, and author's name. Use color, different fonts, and graphics to make your book mark more interesting or "eye-catching."
