Book

Author's Last Name, Author's First Name. Title of Book. Publishing City: Publisher, Year Published.

Example:

Parson, Alexander. Amazing Spiders. New York: Apple Publishing, 1990.

Encyclopedia Article (print)

"Title of Article." Name of Encyclopedia. Year.

Example:

"Spiders." The World Book Encyclopedia. 1999.

Encyclopedia Article (Internet)

"Title of Article." Name of Encyclopedia. Date Information Found.

Example:

"Spider." World Book Online. June 20, 2000.

Web Page

Title or Name of Site/Page. Date Information Found. <web page address>

Example:

Westside Spidermania! July 28, 2003.

Image (Internet)

"Name or description of image." [Online image] Date found and saved. < web page address >

Example:

"Trapdoor Spider." [Online image] July 13, 2003.

"Name or description of sound." [Online sound] Date found and saved.
