Passed in 2015, the District of Innovation concept gives traditional independent school districts most of the flexibility available to Texas' open-enrollment charter schools.

A draft District of Innovation plan has been created by the Board-approved DOI committee. The next step is to post it to the website for 30 days for public comment. This draft was reviewed at an Academics Committee and is being brought to the full board for discussion.

Becoming a District of Innovation gives districts most of the flexibilities available to Texas' open enrollment charter schools. The vast majority of Texas school districts are Districts of Innovation.
