



Connally Student Dress Code



- ★ Bottoms should cover all skin above fingertips* (including pants/jeans with holes, shorts, and skirts). Bottoms must be worn at the waist, no loose fitting or oversized pants permitted.
 - *While standing or walking with hands naturally by side, bottoms must not be shorter than the longest finger.
- ★ Clothing should cover chests, midribs, backs, and undergarments. Crop tops are not permitted even with an overshirt/jacket. Undergarments should not be visible nor worn as outer garments (ie. corsets/undershirts). Shirts must have over-the-shoulder straps at least the width of an ID or credit card.
- ★ For safety purposes, no trench-style coats, wallet/dog chains, collars, or spiked jewelry are permitted.
- ★ Clothing, accessories, or personal grooming that depict sexual slogans, gangs, tobacco, alcohol products, drugs, weapons, or violence are not permitted.
- ★ Pajamas, lounge pants, and houseshoes are not permitted.
- ★ For safety purposes, all shoes/sandals must have a built in back strap or closure.
- ★ All jewelry must be school appropriate; earlobe spikes and/or spacers are not permitted.
- ★ Tattoos are not permitted and will be covered at all times. Body art in any form to include writing on skin and distracting or inappropriate stickers is not permitted.
- ★ Headwear, including hoods, must not be worn in buildings (not to include religious headwear).

Because fads in dress and grooming are subject to sudden and sometimes radical change, modifications to the dress code may be announced, implemented, and enforced during the course of the academic school year.

Final determination of acceptable dress and grooming rests with the principal or his/her designee.
