At the July 25, 2023, regular board meeting, Administration explained the reasons why the District has to approve an agreement with the Texas Education Agency ("TEA") to purchase attendance credits in the 2023-2024 fiscal year in order to reduce the District's revenue level. Based on the TEA's calculation, the District's Tier Two Level Two yield per weighted average daily attendance (WADA) will exceed the Tier Two Level Two guaranteed yield which will result in excess revenue.

However, TEA is using estimates that, by their own admission, are not current as TEA is using 2022 taxable values to estimate 2023 taxable values and an enrollment estimate for 2023-2024. Nonetheless, under statute school districts that have been notified by the TEA of local revenue in excess of entitlement must enter into an agreement with the TEA to reduce its revenue. Failure to comply with the statute will prevent a district from adopting its tax rate.

The District will not have excess revenue in 2023-2024 and will therefore not have to pay recapture

The Board approved an ordinance fixing and levying the ad valorem taxes for the 2023-2024 school year. The total adopted tax rate per \$100 of assessed valuation is \$1.0117 (\$0.6762 for Maintenance and Operations and \$0.3355 for Interest and Sinking).

For the 2023-2024 school year, we delegated contractual authority to obligate the school district under Texas Education Code(TEC) §11.1511(c)(4) to the superintendent, solely for the purpose of obligating the district under TEC, §48.257 and TEC, Chapter 49, Subchapters A and D, and the rules adopted by the commissioner of education as authorized under TEC, 49.006. This included approval of the Agreement for the Purchase of Attendance Credit or the Agreement for the Purchase of Attendance Credit (Netting Chapter 48 Funding).
