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





THE SAT IS AN ENTRANCE EXAM CREATED BY THE COLLEGE BOARD THAT IS USED BY MOST COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES TO MAKE ADMISSIONS DECISIONS. THE PURPOSE OF THE SAT IS TO MEASURE A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT'S READINESS FOR COLLEGE, AND PROVIDE COLLEGES WITH ONE COMMON DATA POINT THAT CAN BE USED TO COMPARE ALL APPLICANTS. COLLEGE ADMISSIONS OFFICERS WILL REVIEW STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES ALONGSIDE YOUR HIGH SCHOOL GPA, THE CLASSES YOU TOOK IN HIGH SCHOOL, LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION FROM TEACHERS OR MENTORS, EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES, ADMISSIONS INTERVIEWS, AND PERSONAL ESSAYS. 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



MUSTANGS dress for success

- Crop Tops, spaghetti straps, midriff tops or tops that are too revealing will be prohibited.
- Shorts and skirts must not to be shorter than 4 inches above the knee.

At JJHS we recognize the importance of individuality with regard to dress; however, the learning environment needs to be free of disruptions and distractions that dress code violations cause. Students will be expected to follow the dress code guidelines set forth by the district. - Students wanting to attend school-sponsored dances including prom must be in good academic standing, to include grades, attendance, and discipline, as per the John Jay Student Handbook.




Checking Out students from the school








### **STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL**

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

### COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol. The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

### HOLD "In Your Room or Area.

Clear the Halls.' Students are trained to:

· Clear the hallways and remain in their room or area until the "All Clear" is announced

### Do business as usual Adults and staff are trained to:

- Close and lock the door
- · Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual.

### SECURE

Get Inside. Lock outside doors" Students are trained to:


- Return to inside of building Do business as usual.
- Adults and staff are trained to:

### SECURE

## WHAT IF PARENTS NEED TO PICK UP THEIR STUDENT? Depending on the situation, it may not be safe to release the student.

### WILL PARENTS BE NOTIFIED WHEN A SCHOOL GOES INTO SECURE?

When a Secure condition is brief or the hazard is non-violent, like a wild animal on the playground, there may not be a need to notify parents while the Secure is in place.

With longer or more dangerous events, the school should notify parents that the school has increased their security

### LOCKDOWN



"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight" A Lockdown is called when there is something dangerous inside of the building. Students and staff are trained to enter or remain in a room that can be locked, and maintain silence. A Lockdown is only initiated when there is an active threat inside or very close to the building.

### SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A LOCKDOWN?

DURING A LOCKDOWN? The natural inclination for parents is to go to the school dur-ing a Lockdown. Understandable, but perhaps problematic. If there is a threat inside the building, law enforcement will be responding. It is unlikely that parents will be granted ac-cess to the building or even the campus. If parents are al-each ut the endoal, the wull be incidented to Lorentiate to a ready in the school, they will be instructed to Lockdown as

### SHOULD PARENTS TEXT THEIR STUDENTS?

The school recognizes the importance of communication between parents and students during a Lockdown event. Parents should be aware though, during the initial period of a Lockdown, it may not be safe for students to text their parents. As the situation resolves, students may be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification.

### WHAT ABOUT LINANNOLINCED DBILLS?

UNANNOUNCED DHILLS? The school may conduct unsched-uled drills, however it is highly dis-couraged to conduct one without announcing that it is a drill. That's called an unannounced drill and can cause undue concern and stress. Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial an-

nouncement. A drill is used to create the "muscle memory" associ-ated with a practiced action. There is no simulation of an event, simply performing the action.


