It is the equivalent of 1301 and 1302 which is the first college English writing course all students will take regardless of their major. The primary genre we focus on in this course is nonfiction over various topics, as this helps us generate ideas for writing and makes us well-read on multiple topics that will be called upon in a college course and on the AP exam in May.

Early this summer, take a look at the list of nonfiction texts below and pick one to read critically and complete tasks 1 and 2.

Tasks:

- (1) Take note of vocabulary words you do not know, determine what they mean, and understand how they give us insight into the text.
- (2) Pick out/highlight lines from the text that are interesting in how they are written and/or meaning. In essence, these should be lines that speak to the audience and move them.
