NISD's Academic Performance Report was presented by **Dr. Janis Jordan**, Deputy Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction, and a public hearing was held, as required by Texas law. All school districts are required to publish an annual report that includes the Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR), district accreditation status, student enrollment and academic performance, PEIMS Financial Standards Report, a report of violent or criminal incidents, and information received from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) for each high school campus. The report will be available

online on the NISD website and copies of specific reports will be available upon request through the Communications Department.

District of Innovation Plan

Dr. Janis Jordan presented a draft of the District of Innovation (DOI) plan developed by the Board-approved DOI committee. The next step is to post it to the website for 30 days for public comment.

ESSER Funds Review
