# **Superintendent's Report**

## Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- Academic Decathlon. Congratulations to the Academic Decathlon teams from Marshall and Health Careers high schools on their success at the state competition this past weekend. Regional Champions Marshall team were named the state Super Quiz Champions, and placed third overall in large school competition. Health Careers HS will be advancing to the National Academic Decathlon Division IV competition in Frisco, Tex.
- **Bi-District One-Act Play.** Taft, O'Connor, Harlan, and Marshall high schools qualified this week to participate in One-Act Play Bi-District competition.
- Boys and Girls Basketball. Both the girls and boys basketball teams had an outstanding year.
  - The Clark Girls Basketball Team made history by winning the school's first girls basketball state title. The Cougars defeated DeSoto High School, 42-37, in the Class 6A state championship game. Coaches are Head Coach Rihana Houy, and Assistant Coaches Michael Byrne and Jennifer Woods.
  - The Brennan Boys Basketball Team had an incredible year and are UIL State 6A State Semifinalists.
     Coaches are Head Coach Koty Cowgill, and Assistant Coaches lan Ward and Jon Sanchez.
- **Special Olympics.** The annual Special Olympics Track and Field Meet was held at Gus Stadium earlier this month. Over five days, 1,200 athletes were able to compete.
- Los Leones. The 24<sup>th</sup> annual Los Leones Student Arts Festival was held recently. This event just gets better every year.
- **Beard ES Light Savers Robotics Team.** Students provided a brief presentation to Trustees on the importance of conserving energy and on the benefit of solar power.
- **School safety concerns.** With recent incidents at several campuses in the district, Dr. Woods addressed the issue of school safety and reiterated the district's continued commitment to keeping the community informed.
- Superintendent transition. Dr. Woods complimented the Board on their selection of Dr. John Craft as the District's new superintendent. Craft is set to begin in his official capacity soon but Dr. Woods will be available to assist and consult with Dr. Craft during the transition of leadership. This Board meeting marks Woods' final one as Superintendent.
- **Video Moment.** The Video Moment showcases an employee who worked as a custodian at Connally Middle School at night to pay his way through college, and is now a first-year history teacher and coach at Zachry Middle School.
- Last Board Meeting for Woods. As this was Dr. Woods' final Board meeting as Superintendent, he shared how grateful he was for his time in the District and just how much he has enjoyed working with the amazing students, parents, teachers, and staff.

# **Board Members' Report**

- Trustee Karen Freeman informed Trustees of Texas Association of School Boards' A Day at the Capitol event scheduled for April 11.
- Trustee Gerald Lopez congratulated the high school theatre groups on their success at bi-district One Act Play competition. Congratulated the District's athletic program participants and specifically the Clark and Brennan high school teams. Lopez attended the Council of PTA's vendor event, and thanked Dr. Woods for his 31 yeas of service

to NISD.

- Trustee Corinne Saldana congratulated the Clark HS Lady Cougars state-champion basketball team and the Brennan HS boys basketball team on their successful seasons. She thanked all of Northside's athletic trainers. Saldana attended the Los Leones Art Festival and acknowledged Fine Arts Director James Miculka and Assistant Director Elizabeth Sanchez-Lopez for their work in facilitating the event. She wished all the soccer teams headed to playoffs the best of luck. She attended a family and community partnership event at NAC focused on community engagement. She attended the Texas Caucus of Black School Board Members and thanked Trustee Bobby Blount for his leadership with the organization. Saldana also participated in a career fair hosted by Mead ES and enjoyed speaking with the students.
- Trustee M'Lissa Chumbley facilitated the presentation of a gift to Dr. Woods from Steve Chumbley on behalf of the Walter Gerlach Livestock Show. The gift was a token of appreciation for Dr. Woods' support of the annual livestock show and auction. Chumbley participated in a recent Northside Education Foundation (NEF) grant patrol event and recognized two grant recipients: Sotomayor HS librarian Stacey Quick and Hector Garcia MS art teacher Cristina Valenzuela. She also thanked NEF mascot Evelyn Nordstrom and Hector Garcia MS mascot Lincoln Forbes who stepped into the role of a NEF Apple mascot. Chumbley attended the Los Leones Art Festival and recognized how much the event has grown over the years. She acknowledged Director of Fine Arts James Miculka and all the Fine Arts staff and art teachers. Chumbley shared that she will miss Dr. Woods and his leadership and believes he has always made decisions based on what is good for children.
- Trustee Bobby Blount has enjoyed his time as the longest serving member on the NEF grants committee. He participated in the recent Texas Caucus of Black School Board Members conference. Blount reminded Trustees of the annual solar race car competition scheduled in April. He shared his appreciation of Dr. Woods and how Woods was always recognized by students at District events.
- Trustee Carol Harle shared that there will be a free book giveaway the largest library event in the District hosted at Brennan, Holmes, and O'Connor high schools. She described giving the Clark HS girl's state-champion basketball team their medals as a highlight. Harle referenced a field trip initiative by gifted & talented staff that afforded elementary GT students a chance to participate in a scavenger hunt in downtown San Antonio. She enjoyed the recent STEM fest event hosted by students at Jay Science & Engineering Academy (SEA.) She closed by sharing some personal reflections of Dr. Woods in his various roles of teacher, campus administrator, and superintendent.

# Recognitions

- NSITE students, National Speech and Debate Association competition. The NSITE/Holmes Speech and Debate
  Team attended the National Speech and Debate Association (NSDA) National Qualifier in late February. The meet is
  only open to NSDA members and schools are given slots based on student participation at speech and debate
  invitationals during the school year. Athan Swick, a senior at NSITE, is the first student in NSITE/Holmes history to
  qualify for the National Meet, by placing third in International Extemporaneous Speaking. The national competition
  will be held in Phoenix this summer. In addition, Swick placed 10th and Junior Mariam Botana De Armas placed 14th
  in Congressional Debate.
- Sasha Luevano, 2023 Administrator of the Year for the Texas Association for Literacy and Adult Education.
   Sasha Luevano, Adult Education Program Coordinator, was named the Administrator of the Year for the Texas
   Association for Literacy and Adult Education during their annual conference in February. The recipient of this award
   must demonstrate a contribution to adult education at the community, state, and/or national levels. The Outstanding
   Administrator of the Year Award is awarded to an adult education administrator with five or more years of experience
   who has made an outstanding contribution to others.
- Academic Decathlon Qualifiers. From the regional Academic Decathlon competition, four teams advanced to the state competition – Marshall HS, Warren HS, O'Connor HS, and Health Careers HS. And for the second time in a row, Health Careers High School won the state title and is advancing to the National Academic Decathlon Division IV competition in Frisco. In addition, the Marshall team was named the state Super Quiz Champions, and placed 3rd overall.
