# **Superintendent's Report**

# Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- First Day in NISD. Dr. Craft reported that he started his first day in Northside ISD by visiting Villarreal Elementary School. He thanked the Ross Middle School Mariachi that performed early in the morning under the direction of Jesus Gachupin. He also thanked Principal Roxanne Gutierrez, Kindergarten teacher Monica Parker, and ECSE Collab teacher Suzette Reyes for opening their school and classroom for his visit.
- **NISD Museum Association.** Dr. Craft met with members of the Northside Museum Association and several retirees including **Dr. Caroline Wernli** who gave him a very high-level synopsis of the rich history of NISD.
- School Safety Symposium. Dr. Craft discussed that the District held a School Safety Symposium at Brennan High School focusing around school safety and awareness. Thanks to Chief Charlie Carnes, Diana Ely, Kimberly Ridgley, and many others who did a fantastic job preparing and delivering important information and engaging in very important dialogue. ## Trustees approve 2023-2028 District of Innovation Plan

On Nov. 15, 2022, the Board of Trustees approved a resolution to apply to be a District of Innovation (DOI) and appointed a DOI committee to begin drafting the local plan. The plan has five exemptions: the Uniform Start Date, Probationary Contracts, Campus Behavior Coordinator provisions, Educator Certification Requirements, and the Teacher/Administrator Appraisal System. NISD submitted the district's intent to approve the DOI plan to the Commissioner in March, 2023 and the plan was posted for public feedback as required for 30 days. The DOI plan will be in effect for five years and any revisions will require a vote from the Board.

#### **Board approves Self-Funded Managed Consumer Driven Health Plan**

Trustees approved the district's move to a self-funded health care plan for the 2023-2024 school year. Self-funding of a managed consumer driven health plan only means shifting the risk from the health care provider to NISD. This shift in no way will affect an employee's current health care plan with United Health Care. Trustees also approved continuing with United Health Care as our health care provider for the 2023-2024 school year.

#### Trustees approve Growth and Improvement budget

The Board approved a Growth & Improvement staff proposal for the 2023-2024 school year that accounts for the addition of a new elementary school, Reed ES, and additional staffing adjustments. The approved budget allows for an increase of 101.98 campus-based staffing units.
