Superintendent's Report

Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- Safety Center Audits. The Texas School Safety Center is conducting safety audits of schools across the state and have visited campuses in NISD. These audits will continue.
- Speak at MASBA and host for CAST Teach. Dr. Woods had the opportunity to speak at a recent Mexican American School Boards Association conference event. As a pre-conference activity, Dr. Woods also hosted a panel of educational professionals and CAST Teach students.
- **Promotion ceremony for General Jones.** Assistant Superintendent for Technology Services Lori Jones, an Air Force reservist, was recently promoted to the rank of Brigadier General. Jones is the first reservist in the nation to achieve this rank in the area of cyber security.
- Museum Association Retiree Luncheon. The Northside Museum Association held their annual luncheon last
 Tuesday and it was a great opportunity to catch up with a lot of retirees and former colleagues. They got off cycle
 with COVID, so they will have another luncheon in the Spring on April 18, which is their normal time to hold this

Public hearing: NISD earns highest financial rating 20 years in a row

Assistant Superintendent for Budget & Finance Tiffany Contreras reported that for the 20th year in a row, Northside ISD has received the highest rating of "Superior Achievement" under the state's financial accountability rating system, called School Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST). The primary goal of School FIRST is to improve the management of school district's financial resources. The School FIRST rating is based upon analysis of staff and student data reported for the 2020-21 school year, and budgetary and financial data for the 2021 fiscal year. As required by state law, Northside ISD announced and held a public meeting to distribute a financial management report that explains the District's performance under each of 20 indicators and the District's rating.

Attendance zone reviewed for newest elementary school

Trustees heard the boundary proposal for the Reed ES attendance zone prior to the School Boundary Advisory Committee (SBAC) meeting and the Public Hearing on Dec. 1. The SBAC, assisted by staff, will review the staff proposal, study relevant data, conduct a public hearing, analyze information as required by policy, and make formal recommendations to the Board concerning attendance zones. Elementary schools involved in the proposal are **Henderson** and **Kallison**. Reed ES will open in 2023 and is funded by School Bond 2018.
