Superintendent's Report

Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- **Veteran's Day.** Many events took place at campuses across the District in recognition of Veteran's Day. Dr. Craft thanked all veterans for their service and recognized Trustees **Bobby Blount** and **David Salcido** for their service.
- **NEF Gala.** The annual gala event hosted by the Northside Education Foundation (NEF) was a great success and the fundraising portion of the event surpassed last year's efforts. Dr. Craft recognized the NEF Board, Executive Director of Community Outreach and District Advocacy **Kelly Rasti**, and all staff and volunteers who assisted with the event.
- Red Ribbon Week. Campuses across the District support activities during Red Ribbon Week. Dr. Craft attended two
 of these events. Hobby MS hosted Red Ribbon activities that included students from Clark HS. Mary Hull ES

Trustees hear safety audit report

As required by state law, school districts must conduct a safety audit of all district facilities at least once every three years. This year again, the audit was conducted by Shane Allard, NISD Safety and Security Officer, who provided a summary report of overall audit scores.

Trustees approve attendance zone for Chumbley ES & associated boundary change

Trustees heard the report from the School Boundary Advisory Committee (SBAC) regarding the proposal for the Chumbley ES attendance zone. The SBAC conducted a public hearing on Oct. 25, and after listening to the public comments and reviewing all relevant data, made a formal recommendation to the Board regarding the attendance zone. This boundary change will affect approximately 576 projected Cole students moving to Chumbley ES, and approximately 286 projected Cole students moving to Galm ES. Chumbley ES will open in 2024 and is funded by School Bond 2022. The approved attendance zone is posted on the campus' website.
