Superintendent's Report

Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- Future Ready Superintendent Leadership Network (FRSLN). Around 200 school superintendents and their cabinet staff from across the state visited the district for the FRSLN meeting hosted by NISD. Part of the program included visits to five campuses Cole, Franklin, and Leon Valley elementary schools, Ross MS, and Marshall Law & Medical Services Magnet HS.
- Changes to accountability system. We have been attending meetings on upcoming changes to the accountability system. These proposed changes will need to be closely monitored in the upcoming Legislative session.
- Anniversaries/Dedication. We have recently celebrated the 25th anniversaries of Jay Science and Engineering Academy and the dedication of Sotomayor High School.
- **NXTLevel.** The President of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas recently visited NISD to learn more about NXTLevel, a partnership with the City of San Antonio geared at supporting students who have left school.
- Carnahan Arbor Day celebration. Carnahan ES hosted their annual Arbor Day celebration and hosted the campus' namesake, life-long science educator **Peggy Carnahan**, at the event.

Chumbley recognized the collaboration between Ross MS, CCA, and ASTA featured in the evening's video moment. She also thanked Dr. Woods for his support with the initiative. Chumbley enjoyed participating in a career day event

at **Scarborough ES** where she had the opportunity to speak with students about her role as a Trustee. Resolution to consider designation as District of Innovation

Trustees approved a resolution to consider designation of the District as a District of Innovation. Any final decision to proceed in securing the designation would take place after a public hearing and input from a citizens advisory committee.
