# Superintendent's Report

# Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- **Gerlach Show.** Last month was the annual Walter Gerlach Livestock Show and Sale. The auction raised another record amount for student scholarships over \$1.4 million. Thanks to the community for their continued support of this long-standing tradition.
- **Esports Tournament.** Last month, the District hosted the first NISD esports tournament with more than 300 middle and high school students participating. It's the second year the extracurricular activity has been offered.
- **JROTC Drill Meet**. Dr. Woods attended the Bear Classic JROTC Meet held at **Brennan HS**. He was impressed by the formal inspection, unarmed and armed drill performances, and a physical training competition. He thanked **Colonel Gary Salmans**, the Brennan administration, and the many staff and volunteers it takes to run a meet of that size and sophistication.

## Trustees hold Public Hearing on Texas Academic Performance Report

NISD's Academic Performance Report was presented by **Dr. Janis Jordan**, Deputy Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction, and a public hearing was held, as required by Texas law. All school districts are required to publish an annual report that includes the Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR), district accreditation status, student enrollment and academic performance, PEIMS Financial Standards Report, a report of violent or criminal incidents, and information received from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) for each high school campus. The report will be available online on the NISD website and copies of specific reports will be available upon request through the Communications Department.

## **Board approves Budget Amendment #2**

The Board approved Budget Amendment #2. General Fund revenue was amended to recognize a net reduction of \$45.2 million with a majority due to low campus attendance impacting the District's average daily attendance. General Fund Expenditures are being amended to recognize a net decrease of \$44.6 million with the majority represented by the following.

- Expenditure budget reduction due to reduced average daily attendance includes reducing salary budgets related to increased vacancies \$27,299,755
- Expenditure reduction related to the state supplanting of ESSER II funds for the 19-20 hold harmless received by the district \$19,902,46

Child Nutrition revenue is being amended to recognize an increase of \$6.5 million related to increased meal participation and the Supply Chain Assistance Grant. Child Nutrition expenditures are being amended to recognize an increase of \$2.2 million related to the opening of Sotomayor HS and the Supply Chain Assistance Grant.

## **Board approves Retention Pay Resolution**

Trustees approved a resolution regarding retention pay for NISD employees who are active full-time or part-time employees as of Jan. 31, 2022. Retention payments would be made after the Texas Education Agency has approved the amendment to the District's ESSER III application.
