Superintendent's Report

Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- Excellence in Education Awards. One Northside principal and two teachers are state finalists in the 2022 H-E-B Excellence in Education Awards. The finalists were surprised last month and are Lacy Greco, GT teacher at Leon Springs ES; Jose Garay, STEM teacher at Valley Hi ES; and Dr. Lisa Baker, principal at Communications Arts HS.
- Athletics Accomplishments. The Clark HS girls basketball team made their first appearance in program history at the UIL State Basketball Tournament earlier this month. The Brennan HS boys basketball team advanced to the regional finals. Soccer playoffs will begin later this week and spring sports are underway.
- **Special Olympics.** The annual Special Olympics Track and Field Meet returned to an in-person event at Gus Stadium earlier this month. Over five days, 1,100 athletes were able to compete.
- First LEGO League (FLL) Robotics Qualifiers. It's competition season for many elementary and middle school robotics teams. The District has hosted and will host several qualifiers and Dr. Woods has been able to watch teams in action.
- **NEF Gala.** Earlier this month was the annual Northside Education Foundation Gala and recognition of the 2021-22 Pillars of Character. Thanks to NISD Director of Partnerships **Cassandra Miranda** and the Foundation Board for a wonderful in-person event.
- National Grand Champions. The Brandeis HS Chamber Orchestra traveled to New York City to compete in the
 National Orchestra Cup and won first place, Grand Champions. The group, under the direction of Kevin GarciaHettinger and Assistant Director Olga De Leon, performed at Alice Tully Hall in Lincoln Center and competed
 against some of the best orchestra programs in the country.

- Trustee Gerald Lopez thanked and congratulated the NISD Athletics Department and student athletes. He reminded Trustees of the annual Los Leones event on March 26 which will showcase student artwork. The event will be held at Marshall HS. Lopez recognized Director of Fine Arts James Miculka.

Trustee Corinne Saldana recognized the Clark HS Lady Cougars on a well-played game at the UIL state basketball
tournament. She commended Holmes HS on winning the University Health San Antonio Student Training Program
of the Year Award. Saldana enjoyed attending the opening ceremonies of the district's annual Special Olympics. She

TMEA All-State Musicians

Twelve Fine Arts students from eight high schools were selected to the Texas Music Educators' Association (TMEA) All-State Band, Choir, Orchestra, and Jazz bands. Selection to Texas All-State is the highest public school award for individual achievement in music that a student can receive. It represents the top one percent of student musicians in Texas. Texas Dance Educators Association's Hall of Fame Award

Elizabeth Sanchez-Lopez, Assistant Director of Fine Arts, has been selected to be the recipient of the Texas Dance Educators Association's Hall of Fame Award. Trustees approved 2022 Summer Programs which include regular high school summer programs for remediation and acceleration, programs for middle and elementary school, and state-mandated programs. Also included are enrichment and remediation programs at all levels and programs sponsored by the Adult and Community Education, Bilingual, Career & Technical Education, Fine Arts, and Special Education departments. Trustees approve stipend for HB 3 Reading Academies participants

The HB 3 Reading Academies are research-based professional development courses passed by the 86th legislature in June 2019 requiring all K-3 teachers, including special education teachers, and principals to be enrolled in the HB 3 academies by the 2022-23 school year. Coursework includes 12 modules that require participants to dedicate a minimum 60 hours of work time. The Board approved a proposal regarding compensation using ESSER funds to the teachers and literacy leaders required to complete these academies.
