Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- **Bond Presentations and Early Voting.** Over the last month, Dr. Woods and Cabinet staff have given hundreds of bond presentations to staff, parents, and community groups. As a reminder, Early Voting runs until May 3 and Election Day is May 7.

Administration is now authorized to begin negotiations with the top ranked firm in each category.

Board approves purchase of school buses

Trustees approved a request to purchase 65 full-size buses and 25 mini buses from Longhorn Bus Sales, LLC with Bond 2018 funds. State law requires that buses model year 2017 or newer must have seat belts unless the Board holds a public meeting and vote indicating that the addition of seat belts would create a financial hardship for the District. All buses also have A/C, cameras, and GPS.
