## **Superintendent's Report**

#### Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- **Uvalde assistance.** Following the tragedy in Uvalde CISD, NISD has provided support and assistance in a variety of ways and we are honored to be able to do so however and whenever as needed. We ask everyone to keep that community in thoughts and prayers as they continue to deal with the aftermath and rebuilding.
- **Safety Enhancements.** The District continues to make safety enhancements at many campuses. Included in the consent agenda are enhancements to access controls and replacement of aging surveillance cameras on multiple campuses. School Bond 2022 will allow for these types of enhancements & improvements to continue.
- **Graduations.** Since the last Board meeting in May, nearly 7,000 NISD seniors were graduated and moved into the next phase of life. We wish them well and know we have done all we can to prepare them for a bright future.
- **Budget Elements for Consideration.** This evening two significant elements in the District's budget will be presented for Board consideration: growth & improvement and compensation. G&I serves the purpose of adding or enhancing programs while compensation recognizes the value of our staff and serves as a retention mechanism.
- Two state champs in the District. We are extremely proud of our most recent state champions, the O'Connor HS Softball Team, who we hope to recognize at a future Board meeting. They are our second state champion team this year with the Brandeis HS Girls Volleyball team having won the state title earlier this year. We are very proud of these outstanding athletes.

#### Trustees name two NISD facilities after long-time former employees

Trustees named two facilities after two NISD beloved long-time employees who have passed away fairly recently. The new health clinic to be located next to Jones Middle School will bear the name **Shirley Schreiber**, and the Clark High School competition gym will now bear the name of **Kevin Hamilton**.

**Schreiber** started working in NISD in 1972 at Thunderbird Hills ES (now **Powell ES**), became coordinator of school nursing in 1984, then director of Health Services in 1986. She passed away in October 2018 after working for NISD for 46 years.

**Hamilton** was a 1980 **Clark HS** graduate where he played basketball and baseball. After graduating from college, he returned to his alma mater in 1985 as an assistant coach. He became the head basketball coach at Clark in 1996, and then moved to the Athletics Department as an Assistant Athletic Director in 2010. He retired in 2019 and passed away in March 2022.

#### **Trustees hear SHAC report**

Trustees were presented the end of year report from the 2021-2022 NISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) by Chair **Sarah Knoeckel**. The SHAC is a group of individuals appointed by the school district who represent various segments of the community in order to provide recommendations to the District on coordinated school health programming and its impact on student health and learning.

#### **Trustees approve adoption of State Instructional Materials**

Trustees approved the adoption of Goodheart-Wilcox for middle and high school health. The State Board of Education had previously adopted Goodheart-Wilcox as the only instructional resource for Health that aligned with the TEKS. Subject area textbook committee members reviewed the material along with members of the SHAC. In addition, SHAC held two public meetings during which the public could review and provide input on the materials.

## Trustees approve Flexible School Day for Chavez Academy

Trustees approved an optional flexible school day for the Chavez Academy for the 2022-2023 school year. This is an annual application that must be submitted to TEA if districts plan to participate in the Optional Flexible School Day Program. The goal of this program in NISD's Chavez Excel Academy is to improve graduation rates for students who are in danger of dropping out of school, have dropped out, or who are behind in core subject courses.

#### Trustees approve Growth & Improvement Budget for 2022-2023

Trustees approved growth and improvement packages to be included in the 2022-2023 budget that will be adopted in August. The packages total just over \$24 million and include 180 campus-based positions, 6 non-campus based positions, and over \$10 million in funds for items such as the opening of Sotomayor HS this August, startup costs associated with Reed ES opening in fall 2023, and expanding prekindergarten.

### Trustees approve 2022-2023 Compensation Plan

Trustees approved a \$21.7 million compensation package that will provide salary increases for all employees. Employees will receive a midpoint raise of 2 percent. The raise includes a \$1,250 increase for teachers, librarians, counselors, and nurses. The package also includes a 4 percent midpoint increase for auxiliary staff.

### Trustees approve extending COVID leave

Trustees approved extending COVID leave through the end of December. Employees must show a positive test result from a medical provider or certified testing site, or is the sole caretaker of a minor testing positive. Up to a total of five days is available per employee. Employees who have any questions should contact a COVID Agent in the Human Resources department.
