# **Superintendent's Report**

## Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- **Enrollment update**. Base Day enrollment, taken Sept. 23, shows the District's enrollment slightly higher than expected with the elementary level showing the most growth.
- **EXCEL Award**. Jasmin Thompson, a first grade teacher at Braun Station Elementary School, is the recipient of the 2022-23 EXCEL Award by KENS5 and Credit Human. The surprise announcement was made in her classroom last week.
- Redistricting feedback. The District hosted two public hearings on the proposed changes to the single-member districts.
- **Declaration of Respect signing day.** Trustees will join students and staff across the District in participating in the eleventh annual Declaration of Respect event by signing a declaration promoting anti-bullying.
- Video Moment. In recognition of National Custodial Appreciation Day on Oct. 2, the video moment highlighted a custodian at Helotes Elementary School. He has seen generations of students come and go through those hallways for the past 45 years, and in fact, was once a student there himself. # **Board Members' Report**

- Trustee Gerald Lopez has enjoyed attending multiple sporting events and has appreciated seeing the bands, flag
  teams, and all the students who participate in these types of activities. He congratulated Rayburn MS art teacher
  Larry West who was named the 2022 Outstanding Middle School Art Educator by the Texas Art Education
  Association (TAEA). In addition, Lopez acknowledged that NISD was named a TAEA District of Distinction for 2022.
- Trustee M'Lissa Chumbley shared that Trustees provide updates and reports at their regularly scheduled meetings as a way of keeping fellow Trustees and others informed of all of the great things taking place across the District. Chumbley congratulated architect Craig Noonan on his retirement after a long history of working with NISD on multiple projects. She thanked Trustee Lopez for his efforts to help the many grandparents raising grandchildren. She also announced that Ross MS will be partnering with the Agriculture Science & Technology Academy (ASTA) and Construction Careers Academy (CCA), Principal James Mears to foster the farm to home initiative. She thanked Ross MS Principal Faustino Ortega, Family & Community Liaison Irene Zinsmeister, and librarian Arnulfo (AJ) Talamantes for their efforts. Chumbley thanked the NEF Board and staff who helped host the Annual NEF Gala and recognized student Lorenzo Lopez on his performance at the Gala. She acknowledged the NISD Police Department from command and line officers to those working the state-of-the-art dispatch center and thanked them for working to keep students and staff safe daily. She commented that the police dept. makes a difference in the lives of students and should be celebrated. Chumbley commented on the many Career and Technical Education (CTE) opportunities available to NISD students including in-person clinical rotations at Health Careers HS, internships sponsored by Marek Brothers Construction, and dual credit opportunities. She reminded Trustees that ASTA will be hosting third graders from across the District as they participate in Ag in Action.
- Trustee Bobby Blount spoke about the importance of a personal touch in daily interactions across the district.

- Trustee Corinne Saldana thanked the Northside Education Foundation for their efforts in raising funds to directly support Northside teachers. She thanked the coaches, student athletes, and many parents who have participated in and attended the many athletic events so far this school year.
