# Superintendent's Report

## Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- Family Engagement Conference. Thank you to Director of State and Federal Programs Lisa Turner and her staff for hosting the annual Family Engagement Conference last month. Dr. Woods served as the keynote speaker.
- Jay National Night Out. The Jay HS community recently hosted their annual National Night Out event. Thank you to PTA President Mary Roberts, Jay staff and students, and to NISD trustees who attended.
- AlamoPROMISE. Dr.Woods served on the steering committee for the new AlamoPROMISE program through the
  Alamo Colleges District. The program makes college more accessible by providing for no-cost tuition and mandatory
  fees for seniors graduating in 2020 from 25 participating schools. Jay and Holmes high schools are part of the initial
  rollout and it will expand to include all NISD high schools in 2021-2022.
- **Ag in Action.** Earlier this month, **O'Connor HS** hosted the annual Ag in Action event for more than 1,400 fourth graders. Thank you to the O'Connor HS administrators, agriculture teachers, agriculture students, and Elementary Social Studies Department for their work.

# Public hearing: NISD earns highest financial rating 17 years in a row

Deputy Superintendent for Business & Finance **David Rastellini** reported that for the seventeenth year in a row, Northside ISD has received the highest rating of "Superior" under the state's financial accountability rating system, called School Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST). The primary goal of School FIRST is to improve the management of school districts' financial resources. The School FIRST rating is based upon analysis of staff and student data reported for the 2017-18 school year, and budgetary and financial data for the 2018 fiscal year. As required by state law, Northside announced and held a public meeting to distribute a financial management report that explains the District's performance under each of 15 indicators and the District's rating.

#### Attendance zone reviewed for newest elementary school

Trustees heard the boundary proposal for the **Wernli ES** attendance zone prior to the Oct. 23 School Boundary Advisory Committee (SBAC) meeting. The SBAC, assisted by staff, will review the staff proposals, study relevant data, conduct a public hearing, analyze information as required by policy, and make formal recommendations to the Board concerning attendance zones. Elementary schools involved in the proposal are **Boldt** and **Langley**. Wernli ES, located at 1881 Arcadia Path, will open in 2020 and is funded by School Bond 2014. The proposed boundary will be posted later this week on the Wernli, Boldt, and Langley websites.

#### **Budget amendment approved**

Trustees approved Budget Amendment #1 which decreases fund balance by \$16.8 million in the General Fund. Adjustments include the addition to appropriations resulting from approved carry forward of funds including those for 2018-19 purchase order commitments, campus formula account balances, and high school allotment funds, and start-up funds for newly opened schools. Additional amounts were carried forward from assigned fund balance for anticipated classroom cameras and hail damage insurance proceeds from the 2016 hail storm. The amendment was presented by Deputy Superintendent **David Rastellini**.

## **Board approves 4 bond resolutions**

As part of a bigger debt management plan, Trustees approved four bond resolutions that allow the District to issue refunding bonds not to exceed \$247,240,000, new money authorizations not to exceed \$275,000,000 from School Bond 2014 and School Bond 2018, remarketing of the 2011 Variable Rate Bond Issue not to exceed \$52,425,000, and remarketing of the 2017 Variable Rate Bond Issue not to exceed \$100,000,000.

Trustees gave approval for the District to seek low attendance waivers at **Harlan** and **Brennan** high schools. Both schools had a low attendance this fall.

#### NISD seeks class-size waivers for 26 elementary classrooms

Trustees gave approval for the District to seek class-size waivers for 26 classrooms across the District in kinder to fourth grade. State law mandates a 22:1 ratio of students to teacher in kindergarten through fourth grades. A waiver is required by law should a K-4 class exceed 22:1.
