Attendance zone for Wernli ES approved

NISD seeks class-size waivers for 26 elementary classrooms

Trustees gave approval for the District to seek class-size waivers for 26 classrooms across the District in kinder to fourth grade. State law mandates a 22:1 ratio of students to teacher in kindergarten through fourth grades. A waiver is required by law should a K-4 class exceed 22:1.
