Superintendent's Report

Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- Recognitions. Several talented students and staff were recognized at the Board Meeting for their outstanding achievements.
- Masks/Case Numbers Update. When compared to other similarly sized school districts, NISD is faring better when
 it comes to case numbers. The District continues to track metrics.
- 9-11 Remembrance Ceremony. Dr. Woods attended a 9-11 Remembrance Ceremony hosted by students at Marshall HS/Marshall Law and Medical Services Magnet School.
- **CAST Teach.** Next fall, Northside will open a new high school magnet program focused on education as a profession, CAST Teach. The 9th and 10th grade cohorts will be at Stevens HS and the 11th and 12th grade groups will spend a substantial portion of their day on the UTSA campus where they will have dual credit opportunities. The Firstmark Foundation has agreed to furnish two model classrooms and the school's professional learning library.
- America's Heroes. Two weeks ago, Northside celebrated America's Heroes with free admission for military and first responders at middle and high school athletic events. Dr. Woods thanked the **Athletics** and **Fine Arts** departments for their collaborative efforts to thank the heroes in our community.

• Destination Imagination Global Finals

Over the summer, seven students from the **Jay Science and Engineering Academy** competed in the Technical Challenge at the Destination Imagination Global Finals competition and won 4th place in the world. They were able to watch solutions from other high school teams, including students from China, Korea, India, Pakistan, Turkey, and

Brazil, to name a few. Destination Imagination solutions are solved by students only, without interference from adults, and include all elements of STEAM. In addition to their 4th place win, the team also won a DaVinci Award for their outstanding creativity.

 - **Deborah Ruel-Schaefer**, Director of Career and Technical Education, was selected as the 2021 Outstanding CTE Administrator by the Family and Consumer Sciences Teachers Association of Texas (FCSTAT) Awards Program.
