Dr. Brian Woods reported to the Board:

- Harvest of Hope. Northside ISD was recently honored with special recognition as a Hunger Fighter of the Year by the San Antonio Food Bank at their Harvest of Hope event.
- **Bond Committee Progress.** The Citizens' Bond Committee concluded their work after the past 6 weeks of studying a potential bond election. Committee leads will meet later this week to finalize a recommendation.
- Jay Science and Engineering Academy Science Fair. Earlier this month, the John Jay Science & Engineering Academy held its 20th Science & Engineering Fair and Research Symposium. Over 200 community members, including college students, professionals, and NISD staff served as judges for this event.
