#### 2. Public Hearings

Discussion: A. 2024 Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR)

Texas Education Code Chapter 39 requires each district's Board of Trustees to publish an annual report that includes the Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR), district accreditation status, student enrollment and academic performance, PEIMS Financial Standards Report, a report of violent or criminal incidents, and information received from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) for each high school campus. A hearing will be held at a board meeting for public discussion of the report and should be available in the district.

#### B. Discussion: HB 3 Annual Report and Goals

TEC 11.185 and 11.186 in House Bill 3 requires districts to adopt plans in early childhood literacy and math, as well as college, career, and military readiness. These plans must include an annual review by the Board at a public meeting and Board approval of new targets as well as specific annual goals for five years at the Meets level.

#### Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- Student Ambassadors. NISD Student Ambassadors attended a recent PTA Rally Day in Austin and had an opportunity to visit the State Capitol. Dr. Craft commended the students for doing a great job representing the District. The group is facilitated by Assistant Director of Communications Monica Faulkenbery and Communication Specialist Kailey Loza.
- Special Olympics. Special Olympics events kicked off this week.
- Health Awareness Days. Friday, Feb. 28, is American Heart Disease Day and Rare Disease Day.
- Sphero Olympics. Students recently participated in Sphero Olympics, an engaging STEM event highlighting coding and robotics.
- Basketball Playoffs. Congratulations to three NISD basketball teams that competed in playoff competition: the Brennan HS Girls basketball team and the boys' basketball teams from Sotomayor and Jay high schools. Competing on the evening of Feb. 25 were the boy's teams from Harlan and Brennan high schools. (Update: both teams won and will be advancing to the next round of playoffs.)
- Students Recognized. Several NISD students will be recipients of the Texas Thespian Scholar Award next month.
- NCAA Reading Recognition. Several NISD elementary schools have been recognized in the NCAA Read to The Final Four literacy challenge. They are Wernli, Ott, and Burke elementary schools.
- LibraryPalooza. The 12th annual LibraryPalooza was a success and featured several engaging authors. Attendance was high despite poor weather conditions, with 30 percent of attendees being from outside the district.
- CREST Award. Congratulations to the multiple NISD schools that earned the CREST Award, a recognition by the Texas School Counselor Association. Appreciation was shared for the district's counselors.
- Successful Luncheon. An annual luncheon for former NISD Trustees and Superintendents was held, and many former district leaders attended.
- FFA & Gerlach Livestock Show. Congratulations to the District's agricultural and FFA programs and the Walter Gerlach Livestock Show and Sale for raising \$1.3 million to support NISD students.
- Academic Decathlon. Several NISD schools, including Warren, O'Connor, Marshall, Health Careers, and Clark high schools, placed or participated in a recent Texas Academic Decathlon competition. Congratulations to Diana Johnston from Health Careers HS, who was named Small School Coach of the Year.
- Aquatics Success. Several NISD students wrapped up their swimming and diving season as state competitors.
- Cheer Competition. Congratulations to the Sotomayor HS Cheer Team on their success at the competition.
- Sotomayor Visit. U.S. Supreme Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor recently visited the NISD high school named in her honor. Justice Sotomayor spoke with students and staff on campus in several assemblies. Thanks to the administration, staff, and students at Sotomayor HS for successfully hosting this visit.
- PTA Rally Day. The PTA Rally Day in Austin was an opportunity for PTA members and others to engage in advocacy and dialogue with legislators.
- Legislative Session. The 89th Legislative session is underway, and the district continues to monitor the session and proposed legislation.

#### 4. Board Member's Report

- Trustee Bobby Blount commented that the District hosted the 23 rd annual regional science competition. He updated the Trustees that the Board's teacher scholarship had a total of 23 submissions. Blount said the PTA Rally Day was a great event that afforded an opportunity to talk to legislators. He reminded Trustees of the NCAA Read to the Final Four literacy competition and set a personal goal to read at all of the district's 83 elementary schools by the end of April.
- Trustee Corinne Saldana has been participating in the NCAA Reading competition as a reader at multiple elementary schools. She particularly enjoyed witnessing the Dual Language program at Howsman ES. Saldana said the visit by Justice Sotomayor was a special event, and she commended the campus staff and students for doing an amazing job hosting their school's namesake. Saldana attended the production of Cinderella at Clark HS, visited with the NISD Student Ambassadors, and attended the PTA Founder's Day and the Mid-Year Graduation ceremony. Saldana was impressed by first graders at Cable ES, who invited her to hear them read. #### 9. Business and Finance

Action, Approval, Discussion: A. Budget Amendment No. 2

Budget Amendment No. 2 includes the General Fund and the Child Nutrition Fund. The Debt Service Fund is included but will not be amended.

General Fund revenues are amended to recognize a net decrease of \$3,008,300 for a reduction in SHARS Medicaid reimbursements. General Fund expenditures are amended to recognize a net decrease of \$440,143. The General Fund amendment will result in an increase to the budgeted deficit by \$2,568,157 bringing the deficit from \$93.9 million to \$96.5 million.

The Child Nutrition Fund revenues are amended to recognize a net decrease of \$1,000,000 as a result of less reimbursable meals served during adverse weather conditions. Child Nutrition Fund expenditures are amended to recognize a net increase of \$3,166,868 for the purchase of essential equipment, supplies, and other improvements as part of the fund balance spend down plan required by Texas Department of Agriculture. The Child Nutrition Fund Amendment will result in a budgeted deficit of \$4,166,868.
