#### 1. Recognitions

#### 7. Business and Finance

Action, Approval: A. Notice of Public Meeting to Discuss Budget and Proposed Tax Rate

The Board of Trustees is required by Section 44.004 of the Texas Education Code to provide for the publication of Notice of Public Meeting to Discuss Budget and Proposed Tax Rate ("Notice"). The Notice must contain the District's proposed tax rate for the year 2025, presented in two separate components: the Maintenance & Operation (M&O) Rate and the Interest & Sinking (Debt) Rate. The tax rate that is ultimately adopted for the year 2025 may not exceed the proposed rate shown in the Notice unless the District publishes a higher proposed tax rate in a revised notice and holds another public meeting to discuss the second notice.

It is recommended that the Board call a public meeting for August 26, 2025, to discuss the budget and proposed tax rate.

The board agreed that August 26, 2025, will be the date chosen for the Public Notice.

Action, Approval: B. Consideration and action to approve an Agreement for the Purchase of Attendance Credits (Netting Chapter 48 Funding) [Option 3 Agreement] and to delegate contractual authority to the Superintendent

Administration will explain the reasons why the District has to approve an agreement with the Texas Education Agency ("TEA") to purchase attendance credits in the 2025-2026 fiscal year in order to reduce the District's revenue level. Based on the TEA's calculation, the District's Tier Two Level Two yield per weighted average daily attendance (WADA) will exceed the Tier Two Level Two guaranteed yield, which will result in excess revenue.

However, TEA is using estimates that, by their own admission, are not current, as TEA is using 2024 taxable values to estimate 2025 taxable values and an enrollment estimate for 2025-2026. Nonetheless, under statute, school districts that have been notified by the TEA of local revenue in excess of entitlement must enter into an agreement with the TEA to reduce their revenue. Failure to comply with the statute will prevent a district from adopting its tax rate.

## \*\*\*The District will not have excess revenue in 2025-2026 and will therefore not have to pay recapture.\*\*\*

## TOPICS:

Local Revenue in Excess of Entitlement is either:

3 What is LREE?

A Tier One revenue level that exceeds the district's entitlement, less its available school fund.

· Could happen in NISD with increasing property values and stable or declining enrollment

A district with local revenue estimated to exceed the Tier Two Level Two guaranteed yield of \$49.72.

· Can only happen if NISD accesses copper pennies via a voter-approved tax rate election (VATRE)

Why does TEA think NISD has LREE?

Estimate - Using estimates, TEA calculates that NISD's 2025-26 local yield per penny per WADA will be \$59.10, which is above the Tier Two guaranteed yield of \$49.72.

Unknowns - In the event the district decided to conduct a VATRE in November and access the copper pennies, current calculations indicate the district would have excess local revenue.

Requirement - To ensure there is a process in place for that potential situation, TEA requires districts to complete this process before the adoption of the district tax rate.

Required Next Steps

Submit the district intent/choice for reducing local revenue -->Board approval for the Agreement for the Purchase of Attendance Credit (Netting Chapter 48 Funding) --> Board delegating authority to the Superintendent to submit the agreement to TEA.

- I. In July of every year, TEA will notify districts that they have been identified as having local revenue in excess of entitlement for one or both tiers. NISD received notification on July 15, 2025, for Tier Two.
- II. Under statute, if a district has been notified of estimated LREE by the TEA, there are 3 action items to complete.





Area District VATRE Pennies


