Two incumbents and two new Board Members take the oath of office

Dr. Sonia Jasso and Laura Zapata are officially members of the Board of Trustees. Jasso represents Single Member District 2, a seat previously held by Trustee Dr. Homer Guevara, Jr. Zapata represents Single Member District 5, a seat previously held by Trustee Corinne Saldana. In addition, Dr. Carol Harle, District 6 Trustee, and Karen Freeman, District 7 Trustee, were re-elected for additional four-year terms. All four were sworn in by Judge Sid Harle.

Trustees elect Duran as new Board President

Trustees elected Dr. Karla Duran as the president of the School Board, with Dr. Sonia Jasso elected Vice President, and David Salcido as Secretary.

Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- **School is almost out.** There are only two more school days left in the 2024-25 school year.
- **Graduation season begins.** Our graduation season kicks off on Thursday, May 29, with the Health Careers Graduation at the Northside Sports Gym beginning at 6:30 p.m. Then, we will hold 12 graduation ceremonies at The Alamodome, with three a day from June 3 through June 6.
- **H-E-B Educators of the Year.** Along with Trustee Harle, Craft had the opportunity to judge finalists for the H-E-B Excellence in Education awards.
- **Award Ceremonies.** ASTA hosted its FFA Awards event on May 15 and awarded student scholarships that evening. Many of the scholarship funds were generated at the Gerlach Livestock Show, which raised over \$1 million.
- **NEF 5K Run/Walk.** The annual Northside Education Foundation (NEF) 5K Run/Walk was a tremendous success. Held at Northwest Vista College, hundreds of students, staff, and community members participated in this fundraising event.
- **Retirement & Recognition celebration.** NISD held its annual Employee Retirement and Recognition event at the Northside Sports Gym.
- **Student Voice.** The last session of Student Voice was held and proved to be a bittersweet event with a phenomenal group of students.

- **Trustee Laura Zapata** expressed her gratitude and excitement about being elected to the Board. She thanked her family and friends and expressed her excitement to represent the Northside community.

- **Trustee Carol Harle** congratulated **Marshall LMS** Senior **Ryan Almanza** for hosting a mental health summit. Harle congratulated Trustee Blount on reading to all 83 elementary schools. She attended a Senior Walk event at **Taft HS** – one of many such events at schools across the district. She read to ALE students at **Sotomayor HS**, attended a celebration for clinical teachers, and enjoyed a dinner theatre at **Pease MS**. Harle also enjoyed the Story Fest event held at NAC, Project Acorn at **O'Connor HS**, the district's Retirement & Recognition Ceremony, and the **Rawlinson MS** NJHS induction. Harle was excited to attend a recent CIS Luncheon with her **NSITE** mentee.
- **Trustee Karen Freeman** congratulated Trustee Blount on reading at all district elementary schools. Freeman enjoyed several district events, including the annual Solar Cars races, Project Acorn, Story Fest, and the Retirement & Recognition Ceremony. She recognized Director of Library Services **Lisa Kulka** on a successful Story Fest and the event's featured author **Suzanne Lang**.
