Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- Successful school year. Met with all the campus administrators recently and appreciation was given to the campus administrators for wrapping up a smooth 2024-25 school year.
- **Graduations**. More than 7,000 seniors graduated across 13 commencement ceremonies this month, earning more than \$167 million in scholarships.
- **Northside Education Foundation**. Met with the NEF Board during their annual planning retreat for some teambuilding and strategic planning.
- **Convocation theme.** The theme for this year's Convocation is Northside *Unstoppable*, and planning is underway for another great event.
- **Open Enrollment launch**. NISD launched an Open Enrollment initiative, *Excellence Without Boundaries*, inviting students from across the greater San Antonio area to enroll in a NISD campus.
- Legislative update. The Governor has called a Special Session for this summer to discuss the topic of regulating THC.
- **Video Moment**. This year, the Rising Stars Summer Theater Camp took on the production "Beetlejuice, Jr." The talented middle and high school students put on a wonderful production with only two weeks of rehearsal time. Click here to watch these amazing students.

- Trustee David Salcido highlighted the Rising Stars program and the district's Beetlejuice summer theater
 production, noting how powerful it is that these opportunities are open to all students from Title I schools, including
 some who might have some special needs. He also celebrated an outstanding athletic achievement, congratulating
 Tate Taylor for taking first place in the 100-meter dash at the Nike Outdoor Nationals with an impressive time of
 10.10 seconds.
- Trustee Sonia Jasso expressed her gratitude to the entire NISD team, administration, and staff for their support over the past few weeks as she transitions into her new role. She shared her excitement for what lies ahead and reflected on the honor of attending several graduation ceremonies. Dr. Jasso congratulated the Class of 2025 and extended heartfelt thanks to the teachers and support staff who make these milestone moments possible.
- Trustee Karla Duran expressed deep gratitude to the district's administrative team, applauding their commitment during graduation week. She thanked both new and returning board members for attending the TASB Summer Leadership Institute and officer training. She gave a shout-out to the Northside Education Foundation, highlighting the recent board retreat focused on closing opportunity gaps. Dr. Duran also extended heartfelt thanks to Ray Galindo, who supported her early in her teaching career, and to Coach Stan Laing for his exemplary leadership both on and off the field. She closed by expressing excitement about building a new board culture, embracing growth, and preparing for difficult decisions ahead all while keeping students and Northside's legacy at the heart of their work.
- Trustee Bobby Blount shared that Ayshia Dillard, a recent Brennan High School graduate and member of the Student Voice group, will participate as the producer for 19 dancers from Brennan High School at the San Antonio Area African American Community Fund Renaissance held at the Tobin Center. He noted that Trustees Dr. Karla

Duran, Karen Freeman, and Dr. Carol Harle recently attended a Bexar County School Boards Coalition meeting. He also highlighted a success shared by Lisa Kulka - third graders who made it into the Final Four Reading Contest bracket showed growth in one or more STAAR areas. Blount closed by thanking Ray Galindo for his dedicated service to the district and offered congratulations on his retirement.

- Trustee Laura Zapata thanked Dr. Craft and district staff especially the technology team for their support as she gets acclimated to her new role. She shared how much she enjoyed attending graduation ceremonies, noting the special energy and excitement in each one. While acknowledging the challenges of the current legislative session, she emphasized her readiness to work hard on behalf of the district. She also expressed appreciation for the district's recent retirees, thanking them for their service and wishing them well in their next chapter.
- Trustee Carol Harle began by recognizing Lisa Kulka from Library Services for her outstanding leadership and service as she heads into retirement. She also thanked Stan Laing and Ray Galindo for their leadership and congratulated them on their retirement. Dr. Harle applauded the newest board members for their strong start and expressed pride in the district's representation at the TASB Summer Leadership Institute and Leadership Northside. She gave recognition to Mateo Rawls, who will soon represent Cole Elementary School at the National Spanish Spelling Bee. Dr. Harle highlighted the Rising Stars production of *Beetlejuice*, praising the lead performer for a show-stealing, professional-quality performance. She emphasized the talents of both on-stage and behind-the-scenes students and commended the collaboration among theater teachers. She also shared how a recent conference spotlighted the work of Cable and Westwood Terrace Elementary Schools, recognizing the powerful impact their efforts have on families and thanking their leadership teams for their dedication.
- Trustee Karen Freeman congratulated the new trustees and acknowledged the challenge of completing TASB training, thanking them for their commitment to learning. She reflected on the honor of attending graduation ceremonies, noting that handing a student their diploma is a powerful reminder of why trustees serve working for student success. She closed by emphasizing the importance of preserving Northside's culture and the board's culture as both are vital to the district's future.

Trustees discussed 2025-2026 Compensation Package

Trustees heard a proposal for the 2025-26 compensation package. Additional discussion will be held at a called meeting on July 15, with a vote expected on July 22.

Trustees hear SHAC Annual Report

SHAC Chair **John Carollo** presented the end-of-year report from the 2024-2025 NISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) to the trustees. The SHAC is a group of individuals appointed by the school district who represent various segments of the community and provide recommendations to the District on coordinated school health programming and its impact on student health and learning.

Trustees approve Flexible School Day for Chavez Academy

Trustees approved an optional flexible school day for the Chavez Academy for the 2025-2026 school year. This annual application must be submitted to TEA if districts plan to participate in the Optional Flexible School Day Program. The goal of this program in NISD's Chavez Excel Academy is to improve graduation rates for students who are in danger of dropping out of school, have dropped out, or are behind in core subject courses.

In addition, the Board approved a partnership with Graduation Alliance as part of an effort to expand support for students who are off track to graduate. This organization will coordinate with Chavez Academy to locate over-age/under-credited students who are not enrolled in school and provide a pathway to meet the criteria to become students at Excel and earn their high school diploma.
