Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- **Fine Arts Events**. In this holiday season, there are numerous fine art events taking place across the District. For a complete listing, <u>click HERE to view events by date or location</u>.
- Athletic Season Begins. The District is kicking off basketball season.
- **Golf Tournament.** Brandeis HS hosted one of the largest golf tournaments recently in support of Toys for Tots, a program hosted by the U.S. Marine Corps.
- Campus Visits. Dr. Craft had the opportunity to visit several campuses, including Valley Hi ES, where they hosted activities around seasonal holidays, and Wanke ES, where he visited the ALE classroom and read to students.
- Anniversary Event. Raba ES will be celebrating its 25th anniversary event on Dec. 16 at 6 p.m.
- **E-Sports Championship.** Competitors will participate in the e-Sports Championship, set for Dec. 13 at the Northside Activity Center.
- Mid-year Graduation. The date for the Mid-year Graduation event is Feb. 11 and will take place at the Northside Sports Gym.
- College Board Event. Dr. Craft participated in a recent College Board event and informed Trustees that the Board is
 making efforts to expand access to Advanced Placement (AP) courses for all students. Additionally, he shared that
 innovative coursework will be coming soon in the areas of cybersecurity and personal finance.
- **General Elections.** With San Antonio officials considering the possibility of moving city general elections to November, Dr. Craft briefed Trustees on the potential financial implications for the district as a result. Craft informed Trustees that the Bexar County Education Coalition (BCEC) and its Executive Director, **Julia Grizzard**, will address this matter on behalf of school districts to city officials. Craft thanked City Council members **Ivalis Meza Gonzalez** and **Ric Galvan**, both of whom were present at the meeting, for their support.
- **Special Performance.** Prior to and at the beginning of the Board meeting, students from Bear Harmony from Brennan High School, under the direction of **Jimmy Garrett**, performed seasonal music for the Board and those in attendance.

- Trustee Sonia Jasso attended multiple campus events, including a Warren HS Honors Choir performance, the Bernal MS Multicultural Event, and a musical production of Once on This Island at Taft HS. - Trustee Karla Duran acknowledged students at Marshall HS who helped deliver turkey meal bags to needy families
 during the Thanksgiving holiday. She thanked the Brennan HS Bear Harmony group for their performance. Duran
 participated in the NEF Grant Patrol and thanked all of the volunteers and partners who helped deliver grants to
 classroom teachers. She wished all patrons a Feliz Navidad and thanked fellow Trustees for their time and
 commitment.
- Trustee Bobby Blount participated in a student podcast at Communications Arts HS, attended the Bernal MS
 Multicultural Event, and attended a solar car training event for sponsors. Blount completed his goal of visiting all 95
 Learning Tree school sites and enjoyed meeting with site leaders and staff. He announced that the Great San
 Antonio Reading competition is progressing with students across San Antonio accumulating over 2 million minutes
 already.
- Trustee Laura Zapata commended the Warren HS Honor Choir on their recent performance which she attended. She also attended the musical production of Once on This Island at Taft HS and commended Theatre Director

Amanda Pyle on the incredible performance. Zapata wished all students and teachers good luck during the upcoming exam season and acknowledged the support of all teachers for students who are undoubtedly ready for a much-needed break. She acknowledged Executive Director of Fine Arts **Elizabeth Sanchez-Lopez** and recognized Dr. Craft and his Cabinet for all of their work and dedication.

- Trustee Carol Harle attended two NEF events the Donor Appreciation event and a NEF Grant Patrol. She acknowledged the much-appreciated support from donors like Cavender Cares, Katie and Jim Reed, and JLA Communications all of whom were honored in the event. She also thanked the members of the NEF Board, as well as the student groups that participated at the event, including the Brandeis HS choir and the Stevens HS jazz band. Trustees vote to expand of PreK program

Trustees discussed the possibility of expanding the district's PK program to include a limited number of qualifying three-year-old students, with opportunities to blend eligible PK3 students into PK4 classrooms when developmentally appropriate and operationally feasible, beginning in the 2026-27 school year. In addition, this expansion would include the discontinuation of the NISD PK Tuition program at the end of the 2025-26 school year. Current enrolled students would be allowed to continue for the 2026-27 school year.

Trustees hear report on Virtual School

The Board heard a report on potentially establishing a 100% Virtual School with the purpose of retaining and recruiting students to increase enrollment. The phased-in approach would begin with grades 9 through 12. Starting in the 2026-27 school year.

Trustees consider the rename Colonies North Elementary

In accordance with Board Policy, Trustees will solicit community feedback regarding the potential renaming of Colonies North Elementary School. This decision follows the submission of name nominations by the community.
