Ensuring Student Success

High school credit courses enhance student confidence during their time in middle school and set them up for success in high school.


Increasing Student Access

Completed high school credit courses increase student opportunity to enroll in high-interest or advanced courses during their time in high school.











Attendance Requirement

The state establishes
enrollment and attendance
parameters in order to
receive credit in a high school
credit course.

Grades

Average of each marking period (MP) grades


Semester Exam (Fall and Spring)

Students must obtain a final grade of 70% or above to receive credit

Credit

The final grade earned in each high school credit course counts towards the high school Grade Point Average (GPA)

Students must have at least 22 credits to graduate High School

8th - Required HS Pathway Courses




All NISD 8th grade students participate in a HS Pathway Course:

- Methodology for Personal and Academic Success (MAPS)
- AVID (Program enrollment is via application only)
- Innovative Thinkers (GT only)

*all meet speech requirement for NISD graduation

Benefits

- Offers opportunities for early participation and success in high school credit courses
- Develops a sense of efficacy and an improved understanding of high school requirements
- Ensures students engage in long term planning and supports College, Career and Military readiness
- Provides space and flexibility in the high school schedule for students to enroll in additional high-interest courses



HS Credit Courses: Attendance Parameters

Students enrolled in a high school credit course must be present for a minimum of 75% of the days the class meets to be ELIGIBLE to earn the credit.

Students become ineligible to earn the high school credit once this threshold is exceeded.

Courses

- Advanced MS Algebra
- Art I HS
- Studio Art 3 HS
- Spanish (any level)
- Principles of Human Services
- Principles of Applied Engineering

Parameters

Maximum number of absences is **17 days**

Eligible for attendance recovery if **18-44** absences

NOT eligible for attendance recovery if **45+** cumulative absences

(MUST retake course for credit)

Reminder

A student may not begin Attendance Recovery until they have lost credit due to absences. In a year-long course, this occurs on the 18th absence.





8th - HS Pathway Courses: Attendance Parameters

Students enrolled in a high school credit course must be present for a minimum of 75% of the days the class meets to be ELIGIBLE to earn the credit.

Students become ineligible to earn the high school credit once this threshold is exceeded.

- AVID 1 A HS

FALL Parameters

Maximum number of absences is **9 days**

Eligible for attendance recovery if **10–22** absences

NOT eligible for attendance recovery if **23+** absences (MUST retake course for credit)

SPRING Parameters

Maximum number of absences is 9 days

Eligible for attendance recovery if **10–22** absences

NOT eligible for attendance recovery if **23+** absences (MUST retake course for credit)






Important Reminders

- ★ Absences outside the parameters on previous slides will result in *denial of credit*-regardless of the grade earned in the course
- ★ Absences in high school credit courses follow students among NISD schools
- ★ BOTH excused and unexcused absences count towards the total allowable absences
- ★ Absences coded as "Health" are not counted as an absence (neither excused or unexcused); for an absence to be coded as "Health" students must start or end their day on campus
- ★ Absences coded as "ESB" Excused School Business are not counted as an absence





Parameters for Attendance Recovery (AR)

To be eligible to recover attendance, absences can NOT exceed: 8th HS Pathway Courses: Fall = 22 / Spring = 22 Other HS Credit Courses = 44

Recovering "seat time" is a minute for minute exchange.

Must occur **BEFORE** or **AFTER** school hours in an **IN-PERSON** setting.

Lunch time may **NOT** be utilized for AR.

AR may ONLY begin after the student has lost credit in the course due to having exceeded the number of allowable absences.

Deviation from this practice is considered "banking" hours and is not allowed


Students must work on assignments for the specific course for which they are retrieving attendance.

Work will be provided by the HS credit teacher.

Alternate Work **Options:** The HS credit teacher will provide opportunities to demonstrate proficiency of concepts through tutoring, alternate assignments, independent projects etc

For students enrolled in multiple HS credit courses, it is important to identify the course for which they are retrieving time/attendance.
