

CCMR At-A-Glance for Families: How can a student achieve CCMR?

What is College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR)?

A measure that schools use to determine if a student is prepared for post-secondary opportunities including college, career, or the military.

A student is College Ready by meeting criteria through testing OR courses.

Testing: Meet criteria for both Reading **and** Math in one or more of the assessments below:

TSIA2 (Accuplacer)	ACT	SAT
Exam that determines if students are ready for college-level reading, writing, and math.	College entrance exam that is used for admissions and merit-based scholarships.	College entrance exam that is used for admissions and merit-based scholarships.

Courses: Meet criteria in **any** subject in one or more of the course options below:

AP	Dual Credit	OnRamps	Associate's Degree
Course with an end of year exam that can provide college credit if passed (score of 3, 4, or 5)	Course that allows students to earn college and high school credit simultaneously. One grade is earned.	Course with concurrent enrollment in a high school course and at UT Austin. Both a HS grade and a college grade are earned.	At the Early College High School (ECHS), students can graduate with a high school diploma and an Associate's Degree.

A student is Career Ready by meeting criteria through Career and Technical Education (CTE).

Program of Study Completer PLUS Earn an Aligned Industry-Based Certification	Level I Certificate
Complete a CTE Program of Study and earn an Industry-Based Certification aligned to the Program of Study.	Earn an aligned Level I Certificate while taking a significant number of CTE Dual Credit courses.

A student is Military Ready by meeting criteria through JROTC or enlisting after graduation.

JROTC Completion PLUS ASVAB	Enlistment
Complete 4 years in JROTC and achieve a passing score on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) test.	Graduate and enlist in the Texas National Guard, any of the 6 services in the Armed Forces, or the National Guard for the respective service.

A graduate receiving Special Education Services achieves CCMR by meeting any of the criteria above, based on their diploma type, or their workforce readiness as indicated below.

Advanced Degree Plan	IEP and Workforce Ready
Graduate receiving Special Education Services and earning the Foundation High School Plan with an Endorsement.	Graduate with a completed IEP and demonstrate Workforce Readiness.
