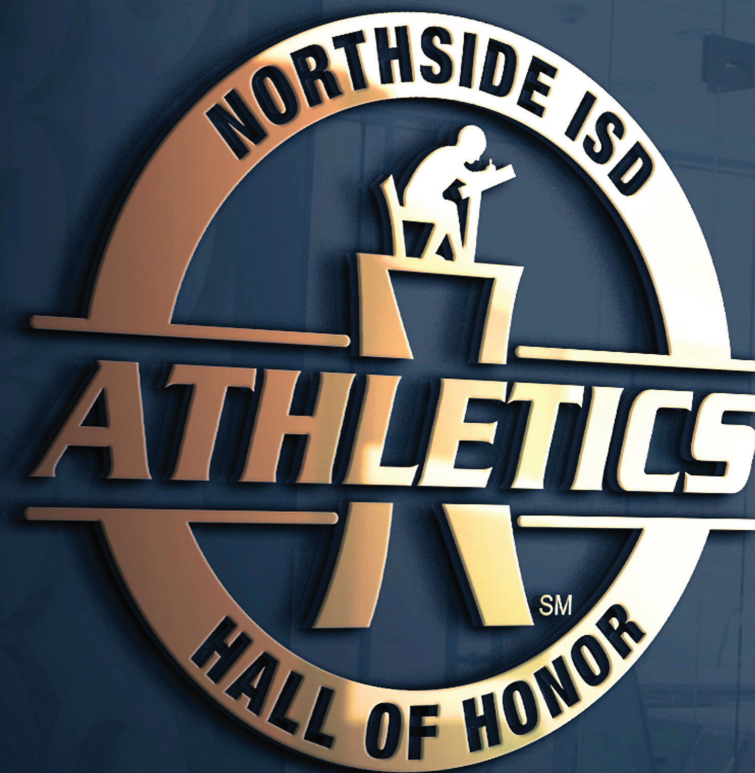

ABOUT THE NORTHSIDE ISD ATHLETICS HALL OF HONOR

The Northside ISD Athletic Hall of Honor was established in 2025 to honor deserving individuals who have participated in and/or have contributed to their school's athletics during their time there or post-graduation in the field of athletics.

There are four categories eligible for nomination and induction in the Hall of Honor: Athletes, Coaches, Contributors/Supporters (athletic trainers, team doctors, sports writers, announcers, etc.), and Teams.

The Induction Class will be made up of the following:

- ★ **Senior Era Athletes** (26 years post-graduation and beyond)
– minimum of two (2) per year
- ★ **Modern Era Athletes** (5 years – 25 years post-graduation)
– minimum of two (2) per year
- ★ **Coaches** (Senior Era/Modern Era) – as voted on by the Committee
- ★ **Contributors/Supporters** – as voted on by the Committee
- ★ **Teams** (5 year waiting period)

The Northside Athletic Hall of Honor Committee nominated the inaugural class of inductees, but anyone will be able to submit nominations at their campus in subsequent years.

Boone Logan
2002 O'Connor High School Baseball

An O'Connor High School standout, Boone Logan is a former Major League Baseball relief pitcher known for his longevity, consistency, and effectiveness as a left-handed specialist. He played 12 seasons at the Major League level and over his career appeared in more than 600 games and recorded 479 strikeouts.

2013 John Jay High School Football

A 2013 graduate of John Jay High School, Reynolds' grit and perseverance served him well to carve out a productive and long-standing professional career. From an unranked recruit out of Jay HS to a veteran who has caught passes in the Super Bowl, Reynolds has repeatedly proved the pedigree doesn't dictate your ceiling – your work ethic does. Reynolds played with the Los Angeles Rams, Detroit Lions, Denver Broncos, and New York Jets.

Coach Romeo "Romy" Vela defined the early 2000s for Jay Boys Basketball. Coach Vela spent nine seasons at John Jay (1998-2007) racking up a stellar 201-101 record. He is most famous for orchestrating what is widely considered the most thrilling, cinematic finish in Texas high school basketball history.

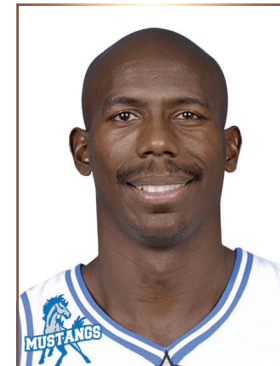
SENIOR ERA ATHLETES



Rita Crockett
1975 Marshall HS Volleyball

A graduate of Marshall High School, Crockett is regarded as one of the greatest all-around volleyball players in history. Known by her nickname "The Rocket," she dominated both indoor and beach volleyball in the 1980s and 1990s. She was a silver medalist at the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles.

Volleyball: University of Houston Collegiate All-American – 1977, AIAW All-American – 1977; FIVB World Championship bronze medal – 1982; Pan American Games silver medal – 1983; Olympic silver medal – 1984; Japan V. League Champion – 1986; World Beach Volleyball Champion – 1989; Italian Women's Volleyball League MVP – 1991; European Club Champion – 1993.

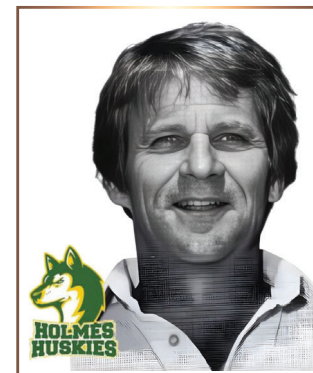


Charles "Bo" Outlaw
1989 John Jay HS Basketball

An outstanding Jay Mustang athlete, Outlaw is a former professional basketball player who enjoyed a highly respected 15-year career in the NBA playing for the Clippers, Magic, Suns, and Grizzlies. He was widely celebrated for his relentless hustle, elite defensive versatility, shot-blocking ability, and infectious positive attitude.

1978 Head Coach Holmes High School

Coach Gary Malesky was a highly respected and successful head football coach. He became the head football coach at Holmes High School in 1978, accumulating a coaching record of 141-49-5 with six NISD district championships. Coach Malesky built a significant legacy in San Antonio high school football, impacting many players and serving as an administrator with Northside ISD after coaching.

SENIOR ERA TEAM

1991 Jay Mustangs Volleyball Team State Champions

The Jay Mustangs Volleyball Team was a force of nature in 1991. They dominated local and regional competition to punch their very first ticket to the state tournament in Austin. Under the guidance of Head Coach Ann Krueger, the 1991 Mustangs put together an iconic season that kicked off a historic four-year run of consecutive state tournament appearances.

2003 Clark Cougars Volleyball Team State Champions

The Clark HS Cougars volleyball team put together one of the most dominant and historic seasons in Texas high schools' volleyball. Lead by Head Coach Kirby Jameson, the Cougars captured the UIL Class 5A State Championship (which was the highest classification in Texas at the time.) This marked the program's second state volleyball title.
