Progress Monitoring and Reporting to Parents:

Measuring Progress	Student progress is monitored through a comprehensive and ongoing process that combines classroom performance, formal assessments, and continuous observation. Teachers evaluate students daily using
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	assignments and classwork aligned to the Texas PK Guidelines, while also incorporating informal strategies such as small group instruction, observations, and quick checks for understanding. Additional information is gained through district screeners, student work samples, projects, and other methods of assessment.
Pre-Kindergarten Promotion Requirements	There are no promotion requirements for students in Pre-Kindergarten. The Texas Education Agency recognizes that young children develop and learn at different rates. Throughout the year, I will support your child's growth and monitor their progress as they build important early learning and developmental skills.
Pre-Kindergarten Report Cards	Your child will receive a Pre-K Report Card reflecting their progress during each of the four grading periods. Progress is based on the Pre-K Guidelines (3-year-old guidelines for young students and Pre-K Guidelines for 4-year-olds). Pre-K-3 students will not get a grade for Science and Social Studies skills on the report card as there are no Pre-K-3 Guidelines for those areas. <i>These areas will be left blank.</i>
Assessments:	
Early Childhood District Assessments	In addition to everyday teacher observations, all three- and four-year-old Pre-K students participate in the CIRCLE Progress Monitoring assessment at the beginning, middle, and end of the school year. Pre-Kindergarten Ongoing Assessments	In our Pre-K classrooms, learning happens through meaningful play, hands-on experiences, and everyday interactions. Teachers carefully observe children as they explore, create, and learn so they can understand each child's unique strengths and areas for growth. Throughout the year, teachers use these observations to plan activities and lessons that meet each child's individual needs and help them continue making progress. This ensures every child is challenged, supported, and successful in the classroom. Teachers also collect examples of your child's learning in a portfolio. This may include photographs, artwork, writing samples, checklists, and notes about important milestones and accomplishments. These collections help us celebrate your child's growth over the course of the school year.

Student Support:

Intervention

In our classroom, we are committed to the success of every student. If a student needs additional support in a specific skill or concept, they will have access to targeted intervention opportunities such as small-group instruction and computer-based interventions. These interventions are designed to close learning gaps and help students build confidence.
