Discussion, Information: A. School Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST)

Assistant Superintendent for Budget & Finance Tiffany Contreras reported that for the 20th year in a row, Northside ISD has

received the highest rating of "Superior Achievement" under the state's financial accountability rating system, called School

Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST). The primary goal of School FIRST is to improve the management of

school district's financial resources. The School FIRST rating is based upon analysis of staff and student data reported for

the 2020-21 school year, and budgetary and financial data for the 2021 fiscal year. As required by state law, Northside ISD

announced and held a public meeting to distribute a financial management report that explains the District's performance

under each of 20 indicators and the District's rating.

13. Human Resources

Action, Approval: A. Property and Boiler/Machinery Insurance 2022/23 Property and Boiler/Machinery Insurance Renewal

Current Situation: Our property & boiler/machinery insurance policy expires on November 16, 2022. The annual premium paid for 2021/22 was \$3,997,845 and includes a \$5MM wind/hail (W/H) deductible per occurrence. Our Property Insurance Consultant, McGriff Insurances, polled the market for insurance rates given the current and past losses. The insurance market remains hard (high demand for coverage in a reduced supply) causing large increases in premiums with higher deductibles.

Factors contributing to premium increases:

- Continued weather-related losses across the US and other countries,
- Our 2016 hailstorm of 68MM
- Our 2019 hailstorm of 4.5MM
- Increase in NISD property value from 3.2B to 3.4B
- Limited commercial insurance providers
- Inflation in general

Recommendation: Remain with the incumbent vendor, Westchester, for option one (1) that provides the same coverage and deductibles that we currently have including \$400MM in policy limits and a \$5MM per occurrence deductible on wind and/or hail damage. All other coverages/deductibles remain the same as expiring. Total Annual Premium \$4,806,586.
