**THE SAT IS AN ENTRANCE EXAM CREATED BY THE COLLEGE BOARD THAT IS USED BY MOST COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES TO MAKE ADMISSIONS DECISIONS. THE PURPOSE OF THE SAT IS TO MEASURE A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT'S READINESS FOR COLLEGE, AND PROVIDE COLLEGES WITH ONE COMMON DATA POINT THAT CAN BE USED TO COMPARE ALL APPLICANTS. COLLEGE ADMISSIONS OFFICERS WILL REVIEW STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES ALONGSIDE YOUR HIGH SCHOOL GPA, THE CLASSES YOU TOOK IN HIGH SCHOOL, LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION FROM TEACHERS OR MENTORS, EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES, ADMISSIONS INTERVIEWS, AND PERSONAL ESSAYS. HOW IMPORTANT SAT SCORES ARE IN THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS VARIES FROM SCHOOL TO SCHOOL.**

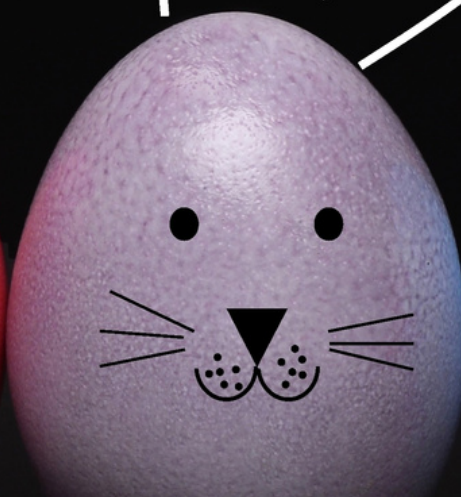

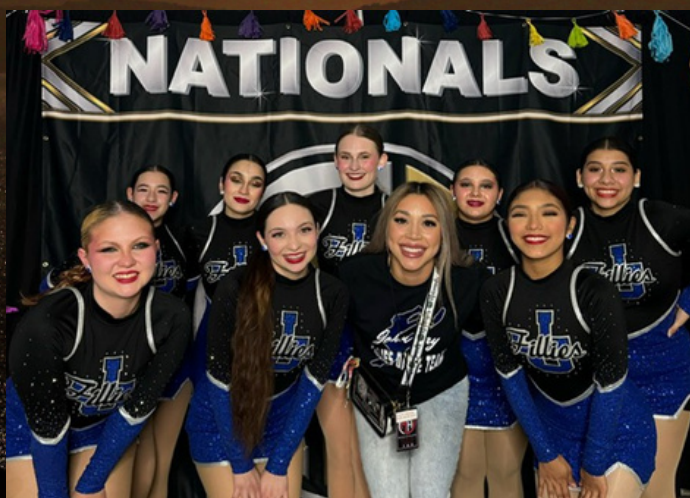

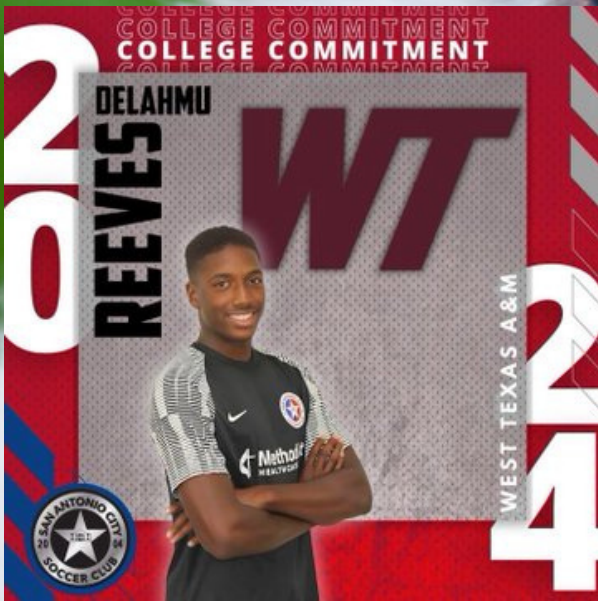

Student attendance not only affects credits (graduation), it also affects:

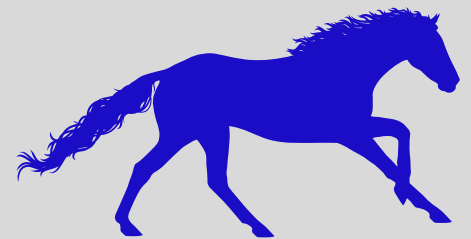
- Obtaining a VOE (Verification of Enrollment) needed to attend Driver's Education classes & to take the driver's test for a driver's license.

## ATTENDANCE Matters

**Texas Compulsory Attendance Law**  
Students must attend class 90% of the school year

**Unexcused & Excused Absences**  
ALL absences count! Students who have more than 17 (year long course) total or 7 Fall/10 Spring absences are at risk of failing. Parent/Guardians may also be issued a municipal court warning and possibly pay a fine.

**Medical Appointments**  
ALL absences count! Students who have more than 17 (year long course) total or 7 Fall/10 Spring absences are at risk of failing. Parent/Guardians may also be issued a municipal court warning and possibly pay a fine.

**Why do I need to send a note?**  
If a student's attendance case is sent to court, a committee will take into consideration how many absences were excused and unexcused.

**High School Credits**  
Students who have not been in attendance for 90% of each class will not earn credits for the affected courses. In this case, please speak to the counselor or administrator about attendance recovery as soon as possible.

**Communication**  
If your child is ill and will be out of school for more than 1 day, please inform the Attendance Secretaries. They should be your first line of communication.

**Special Circumstances**  
Every student's situation is different. If there are barriers keeping your student from being at school, reach out to the Attendance Office.

## STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

### COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

### HOLD

"In Your Room or Area. Clear the Halls."

Students are trained to:

- Clear the hallways and remain in their room or area until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Close and lock the door
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual



### SECURE

"Get Inside. Lock outside doors"

Students are trained to:

- Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock outside doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual



### LOCKDOWN

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

Students are trained to:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend



### EVACUATE

"To a Location"

Students are trained to:

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone
- Follow instructions

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to take anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation.)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- Account for students and adults



### SHELTER

"State Hazard and Safety Strategy"

Hazards might include:

- Tornado
- Hazmat
- Earthquake
- Tsunami

Safety Strategies might include:

- Evacuate to shelter area
- Seal the room
- Drop, cover and hold
- Get to high ground

Students are trained in:

- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies

Adults and staff are trained in:

- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies
- Accounting for students and adults



## STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL PARENT GUIDANCE

### SECURE

"Get Inside. Lock outside doors"



Secure was formerly called Modified Lockdown, and the actions are the same. It is called when there's something dangerous outside of the building. Students and staff are brought into the building and the outside doors will be locked. The school might display the Building is Secured poster on entry doors or nearby windows. Inside, it will be business as usual.

### SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A SECURE EVENT?

Probably not. Every effort is made to conduct classes as normal during a secure event. Additionally, parents may be asked to stay outside during a Secure event.

### WHAT IF PARENTS NEED TO PICK UP THEIR STUDENT?

Depending on the situation, it may not be safe to release the student. As the situation evolves, Secure might change to a Monitored Entry and/or Controlled Release.

### WILL PARENTS BE NOTIFIED WHEN A SCHOOL GOES INTO SECURE?

When a Secure condition is brief or the hazard is non-violent, like a wild animal on the playground, there may not be a need to notify parents while the Secure is in place.

With longer or more dangerous events, the school should notify parents that the school has increased their security.

### LOCKDOWN

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

A Lockdown is called when there is something dangerous inside of the building. Students and staff are trained to enter or remain in a room that can be locked, and maintain silence.

A Lockdown is only initiated when there is an active threat inside or very close to the building.



### SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A LOCKDOWN?

The natural inclination for parents is to go to the school during a Lockdown. Understandable, but perhaps problematic. If there is a threat inside the building, law enforcement will be responding. It is unlikely that parents will be granted access to the building or even the campus. If parents are already in the school, they will be instructed to Lockdown as well.

### SHOULD PARENTS TEXT THEIR STUDENTS?

The school recognizes the importance of communication between parents and students during a Lockdown event. Parents should be aware though, during the initial period of a Lockdown, it may not be safe for students to text their parents. As the situation resolves, students may be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification.

### WHAT ABOUT UNANNOUNCED DRILLS?

The school may conduct unscheduled drills, however it is highly discouraged to conduct one without announcing that it is a drill. That's called an unannounced drill and can cause undue concern and stress.

Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial announcement.

A drill is used to create the "muscle memory" associated with a practiced action. There is no simulation of an event, simply performing the action.
