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


SAT SCHOOL DAY | ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 17, 2024, THE SAT WILL BE ADMINISTERED TO ALL 11TH-GRADE NISD ENROLLED STUDENTS. REGISTRATION IS NOT REQUIRED FOR SAT. ALL ELIGIBLE TESTERS IN ATTENDANCE WILL BE EXPECTED TO PARTICIPATE.

THE SAT IS AN ENTRANCE EXAM CREATED BY THE COLLEGE BOARD THAT IS USED BY MOST COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES TO MAKE ADMISSIONS DECISIONS. THE PURPOSE OF THE SAT IS TO MEASURE A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT'S READINESS FOR COLLEGE, AND PROVIDE COLLEGES WITH ONE COMMON DATA POINT THAT CAN BE USED TO COMPARE ALL APPLICANTS. COLLEGE ADMISSIONS OFFICERS WILL REVIEW STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES ALONGSIDE YOUR HIGH SCHOOL GPA, THE CLASSES YOU TOOK IN HIGH SCHOOL, LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION FROM TEACHERS OR MENTORS, EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES, ADMISSIONS INTERVIEWS, AND PERSONAL ESSAYS. 





Students wanting to attend school-sponsored dances including prom must be in good academic standing, to include grades, attendance, and discipline, as per the John Jay Student Handbook.




Checking Out students from the school



IN ORDER TO SUPPORT THAT COMMITMENT, WE HAVE A COMPREHENSIVE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN THAT ADDRESSES EMERGENCY MITIGATION/PREVENTION, PREPAREDNESS, RESPONSE, AND RECOVERY PROCEDURES.

THE PLAN PREPARES OUR STAFF AND STUDENTS FOR ACTION AND ESTABLISHES TEAMS, CHAINS OF COMMAND, AND SPECIFIC STEPS TO TAKE IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION.

STANDARD **RESPONSE PROTOCOL**

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol. The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

HOLD "In Your Room or Area.

Clear the Halls." Students are trained to:

· Clear the hallways and remain in their room or area until the "All Clear" is announced

Do business as usual Adults and staff are trained to:

Close and lock the door

- · Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual.

SECURE

Get Inside. Lock outside doors" Students are trained to:

Return to inside of building Do business as usual.

- Adults and staff are trained to:
- Bring everyone indoors

WHAT IF PARENTS NEED TO PICK UP THEIR STUDENT? Depending on the situation, it may not be safe to release the student. As the situation evolves, Secure might change to a Monitored Entry and/or Controlled Release.

WILL PARENTS BE NOTIFIED WHEN A SCHOOL GOES INTO SECURE?

When a Secure condition is brief or the hazard is non-violent, like a wild animal on the playground, there may not be a need to notify parents while the Secure is in place.

With longer or more dangerous events, the school should notify parents that the school has increased their security.

LOCKDOWN

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight" A Lockdown is called when there is something dangerous



inside of the building. Students and staff are trained to enter or remain in a room that can be locked, and maintain silence. A Lockdown is only initiated when there is an active threat inside or very close to the building.

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SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A LOCKDOWN?

DURING A LOCKDOWN? The natural inclination for parents is to go to the school dur-ing a Lockdown. Understandable, but perhaps problematic. If there is a threat inside the building, law enforcement will be responding. It is unlikely that parents will be granted ac-cess to the building or even the campus. If parents are al-each ut the enhant, the wull be incidented to Lorentiate to a ready in the school, they will be instructed to Lockdown as

SHOULD PARENTS TEXT THEIR STUDENTS?

The school recognizes the importance of communication between parents and students during a Lockdown event. Parents should be aware though, during the initial period of a Lockdown, it may not be safe for students to text their parents. As the situation resolves, students may be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification.

WHAT ABOUT UNANNOUNCED DRILLS?

UNANNOUNCED DHILLS? The school may conduct unsched-uled drills, however it is highly dis-couraged to conduct one without announcing that it is a drill. That's called an unannounced drill and can cause undue concern and stress. Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial an-

nouncement. A drill is used to create the "muscle memory" associ-ated with a practiced action. There is no simulation of an event, simply performing the action.



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
