## John Jay High School Dress Code

### MUSTANGS dress for success

- Crop Tops, spaghetti straps, midriff tops or tops that are too revealing will be prohibited.
- Shorts and skirts must not to be shorter than 4 inches above the knee.
- Jeans are not to have large holes above the knees.

At JJHS we recognize the importance of individuality with regard to dress; however, the learning environment needs to be free of disruptions and distractions that dress code violations cause.

Students will be expected to follow the dress code guidelines set forth by the district. In an effort to promote a safe and positive school environment which is conducive to learning, our Mustangs should wear APPROPRIATE clothing that will not cause disruptions in learning or safety.

The dress code will be strictly enforced.

The administration of the school has final authority on all matters relating to the dress code. All students violating the dress code may be given clothing to change into or be given the opportunity to request clothing from home from their guardian.

Students violating the dress code will be issued a discipline. Repeat dress code offenders are subject to further disciplinary action.

- Students wanting to attend school-sponsored dances including prom must be in good academic standing, to include grades, attendance, and discipline, as per the John Jay Student Handbook.




## Checking Out students from the school




## Attendance Information



### **ATTENDANCE** Matters





Unexcused & Excused Absences ALL absences count! Students who have more than 17 (year long course) total or 7 Fall/10 Spring absences are at risk of failing. Parent/Guardians may also be issued a municipal court warning and possibly pay a fine.



#### Medical Appointments

ALL absences count! Students who have more than 17 (year long course) total or 7 Fall/10 Spring absences are at risk of failing. Parent/Guardians may also be issued a municipal court warning and possibly pay a fine.



If a student's attendance case is sent to court, a committee will take into consideration how many absences were excused and unexcused.





#### High School Credits

Students who have not been in attendance for 90% of each class will not earn credits for the affected courses. In this case, please speak to the counselor or administrator about attendance recovery as soon as possible.

#### Communication

If your child is ill and will be out of school for more than 1 day, please inform the Attendance Secretaries. They should be your first line of communication

If a student is out for a doctors appointment, a doctor's note needs to be provided to the attendance office.



For a student who has a medical or court appointment during school hours and submits a note to the attendance office, the classes missed will not be considered an absence.



### 10 & 10 Rule & Hall Passes

- You are NOT allowed to be in the halls the first 10 and the last 10 minutes of class time
- This time is for admin to clear the halls and bathrooms
- · Campus safety



- You must have a pink pass or hall pass issued by your teacher to be in the hallway
- If you don't have a pass? We will ask you to return to class





### Attendance



- The state of Texas requires all students to be present 90% of the time in order for credit to be awarded.
- If a student has <u>more than 7 absences</u> during the first semester course, <u>more than 10 absences</u> for a second semester course, or <u>more than 17 absences</u> in a year long course they will be <u>denied</u> credit for the course.



### Attendance



- If you are more than 5 minutes late to ANY period, you are absent.
- The bell to be in class 1st period is 9:00 am.
- If you are coming in late, you will go straight to your class. You do NOT need a pass from the attendance office to go to class.

### **Tardies**

- You must arrive to all classes on time and be prepared to learn
- You have have <u>5 minutes</u> to move from one class to another
- If you are Tardy to class, teachers will mark you Tardy in the gradebook
- Students with excessive tardies will be called into the office and assigned consequences

### **STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL**

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND

#### **COMMON LANGUAGE**

The Standard Response Protocol utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

#### HOLD

"In Your Room or Area. Clear the Halls."

Students are trained to:

- · Clear the hallways and remain in their room or area until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual
- Adults and staff are trained to: Close and lock the door
- · Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

### **SECURE**

Get Inside. Lock outside doors"

- · Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual Adults and staff are trained to:
- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock outside doors
- Increase situational awareness Account for students and adults

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight" A Lockdown is called when there is something dangerous inside of the building. Students and staff are trained to enter or remain in a room that can be locked, and maintain silence.

Secure was formerly called Modified Lockdown, and the actions are the same.

### SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A LOCKDOWN?

DURING A LOCKDOWN?
The natural inclination for parents is to go to the school during a Lockdown. Understandable, but perhaps problematic. If there is a threat inside the building, law enforcement will be responding, it is unlikely that parents will be granted access to the building or even the campus. If parents are all the control of ready in the school, they will be instructed to Lockdown as

#### SHOULD PARENTS TEXT THEIR STUDENTS?

The school recognizes the importance of communication between parents and students during a Lockdown event. Parents should be aware though, during the initial period of a Lockdown, it may not be safe for students to text their parents. As the situation resolves, students may be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification.

#### WHAT ABOUT

UNANNOUNCED DRILLS? UNANNOUNCED DHILLS?
The school may conduct unscheduled drills, however it is highly discouraged to conduct one without 
announcing that it is a drill. That's 
called an unannounced drill and can 
cause undue concern and stress.

Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial announcement.



A drill is used to create the "muscle memory" associ-ated with a practiced action. There is no simulation of an event, simply performing the action.
