Attendance Matters at Northside ISD

- Texas Education Code (TEC) requires that school-age children through the age of 19 years attend each school day for the entire period the program of instruction is provided.
- Absences may be excused for personal illness, medical appointments, family funerals, religious holy days, court appearances, and other excused reasons as outlined in the TEC Sec. 25.087 and at the discretion of the principal or designee. Absence documentation is to be submitted to the school within three days of the absence. Parents are encouraged to retain a copy of all documentation or notes submitted to the school.
- If a student is absent without valid excuse three or more days or parts of days in a four week period, the district will issue an attendance warning notice (AWN) and develop an individualized attendance plan or behavior improvement plan, as required by TEC Sec. 25.095 and Sec. 25.0915.
- Northside Independent School District has adopted a multitude of truancy prevention/intervention measures to meaningfully address student conduct related to truancy or non-attendance. The campus administrator or designee, student, parent, and possibly other relevant individuals including school nurse, school counselor, probation officer, juvenile case manager, truancy specialist, attendance officer or truancy prevention facilitator, convene to collaborate in the development of an individualized attendance plan for the student whereby specific truancy intervention measures are selected in an effort to address the issues that have proven causal to the student's truancy or non-attendance. The individualized attendance plan includes numerous community resources for parent consideration.
- The individualized attendance plan herein constitutes a behavior improvement plan or contract in that the student and/or parent/ guardian agree to implement the truancy measures listed for a period not to exceed 45 school days or what remains of the school year to become effective on the date signed.
- A student should not accumulate 10 unexcused absences in a six month period.

El Distrito puede dar de baja a un estudiante por menor de 19 años falta de asistencia bajo las siguientes condiciones:

1. El estudiante ha estado ausente por 10 días escolares consecutivos
Y
2. Los repetidos esfuerzos del director y/o del oficial de asistencia o especialista en ausentismo escolar para localizar al estudiante no han tenido éxito.

ASISTENCIA POR CRÉDITO

A un estudiante se le dará crédito por una clase sólo si el estudiante ha asistido el 90 por ciento de los días de clase ofrecidos, a menos de que un comité de asistencia nombrado por la Mesa Directiva le dé al estudiante crédito debido a la existencia de circunstancias atenuantes para estar ausente. La Mesa Directiva establecerá criterios para determinar qué es lo que constituye una circunstancia atenuante y debe adoptar políticas que establezcan formas alternativas para que el estudiante reponga el trabajo o recupere los créditos perdidos debido a ausencias por circunstancias atenuantes. La Mesa Directiva puede establecer formas alternas para estudiantes con ausencias injustificadas para reponer el trabajo o recuperar los créditos. Las formas alternas deben incluir al menos una opción que no requiera al estudiante pagar una cuota, pero la opción deberá ser substancialmente la misma que la disponible en el programa educacional para el cual el distrito puede cobrar una cuota. Esta regla no afecta el derecho del estudiante a justificar una ausencia para guardar los días festivos religiosos.

Un estudiante y el padre o tutor del estudiante deben ser notificados por escrito antes de que y en el momento en que la asistencia del estudiante cae por debajo del 90 por ciento de los días de clase ofrecidos. Cuando la asistencia cae por debajo del 90 por ciento de los días de clase ofrecidos, el estudiante, padre o representante debe presentar una petición por escrito al comité de asistencia apropiado solicitando que se le otorgue el crédito. El comité de asistencia debe revisar todo el registro de asistencia del estudiante y las razones de las ausencias y determinar si otorga el crédito.

Las peticiones de créditos pueden ser presentadas en cualquier momento luego de que el estudiante recibe la notificación, pero en ningún caso después de la fecha señalada por el director. La fecha señalada por el director debe ser antes del último día de clases. Cualquier excepción a este plazo requiere de la aprobación del director.

El comité de asistencia puede revisar los registros de todos los estudiantes cuya asistencia cae por debajo del 90 por ciento de los días de clase ofrecidos, independientemente de que sea presentada una petición o no.

Comités de asistencia

La Mesa Directiva debe establecer un comité asistencia o tantos comités como sea necesario para la eficiente implementación del Código de Educación de Texas, Sección 25.092.

El superintendente o la persona que designe puede hacer los citatorios específicos de acuerdo a los requerimientos legales.

Audiencia del comité de asistencia

Los maestros del salón de clases constituirán la mayoría en el comité de asistencia. El comité de asistencia oír todos los casos donde la asistencia de un estudiante está por debajo de 90 por ciento de los días que se ofrece la clase y se ha presentado una petición por parte del estudiante o su padre o tutor. El comité puede otorgar crédito académico al estudiante debido a circunstancias atenuantes de acuerdo a las políticas adoptadas por la Mesa Directiva que establezcan formas para que el estudiante reponga el trabajo o recupere el crédito perdido por las ausencias.

Enfermedad personal

Cuando las ausencias de un estudiante por enfermedad personal exceden los tres días consecutivos, el estudiante presentará una declaración de un médico o de una clínica de salud que verifique la enfermedad u otra condición que requiera del estudiante ausencias extendidas de la escuela. Si el estudiante ha establecido un patrón cuestionable de ausencias, el comité de asistencia puede requerir una declaración de enfermedad del médico o de la clínica después de un sólo día de ausencia, como condición para clasificar la ausencia como una ausencia con circunstancias atenuantes.

Ausencias no excusadas

La Mesa Directiva ha optado por permitir a los estudiantes que han perdido créditos debido a ausencias no excusadas y que tengan una calificación aprobatoria en el curso, recuperar crédito luego de satisfacer lo requerimientos establecidos por el comité de asistencia de la escuela. El comité puede establecer requerimientos más exigentes para recuperar el crédito cuando las ausencias no son excusadas que en otras circunstancias.

Circunstancias atenuantes

La Mesa Directiva ha establecido las siguientes circunstancias atenuantes:

1. Actividades extracurriculares aprobadas por la mesa directiva o presentación pública sujeta a limitaciones.
2. Examen, tratamiento o diagnóstico solicitado para estudiantes elegibles al Medicaid.
3. Citas documentadas para el cuidado de la salud, si el estudiante inicia clases y regresa a la escuela en el mismo día de la cita.
4. Ausencia temporal resultante de cualquier causa aceptable para el maestro, el director o el superintendente.
5. Procedimiento documentado en un corte juvenil por parte de un oficial de probanza.
6. Ausencia requerida por las autoridades de asistencia social locales o estatales.
7. Emergencia familiar o circunstancia imprevista o inevitable que requiera de atención inmediata.
8. Visita aprobada a una universidad.

Las ausencias para las cuales el estudiante ha mostrado circunstancias atenuantes y para las que ha completado las tareas necesarias se considerarán días de asistencia para los cálculos.

Daily attendance is also required of virtual learners. A virtual learner will be counted in attendance as **Present: Remote Asynchronous (RA)** by engaging in online learning in at least ONE of the following ways:

- Teacher/student interaction **on that date**

OR

- Completion and submission of an assignment **on that date** (up until 11:59 p.m.)

OR

- Demonstration of progress in Schoology **on that date**

What does it mean to have “teacher/student interactions that same day?”

This means your child interacts with the teacher for the purpose of moving the student closer to mastery of learning objective(s).

Teacher/student interactions may include (but are not limited to) the following:

- Participating in a live online lesson or activity with the teacher
- Student interactions with teacher/specialist during scheduled time
- Small group instruction/support
- One-on-one instruction/support
- Phone call with the teacher
- Google Meet/Chat
- Conferencing
- Student attends teacher office hours/tutoring

The easiest way for a student to get credit for teacher/student interaction on any given day is to participate in daily live lessons.

What does “demonstration of progress in Schoology” mean?

This means your child logs in to Schoology and participates in the learning opportunities given there by the teacher. Progress in Schoology should reflect a level of engagement and may include, but is not limited to, learning tasks such as:

- Participating in an assigned discussion board
- Editing and revising a piece of work in Schoology
- Other assignments as given by the teacher

The easiest way for a student to get credit for demonstrating progress in Schoology is to log in to Schoology daily **AND** interact with the content and directions provided by the teacher. Merely logging in to Schoology is not enough to be counted in attendance.
