ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL

Arrival

- **Drop Off:** Front of the school
- Doors open at 7:00 a.m.
- Student & Parents Breakfast Time: 7:00 7:35.
- Doors will be monitored and all adults will need a Visitor Pass or Fast Pass to enter the building. If you forget your Fast Pass, you will be required to check in at the front office with a valid ID.
- All parents must depart the building by 7:40, so that we can secure the building for all students and staff.

Morning Drop off & Breakfast starts at 7:00 a.m. School Hours School starts at 7:40 a.m. Students are tardy at 7:45 a.m. Dismissal starts at 3:00 p.m.

<u>Dismissal</u>

There are two dismissal areas:

Front Drive: ECSE, PreK - 1st Grade

Back Bus Loop: ALE and 2nd-5th Grade

Siblings of these students who are in 2nd – 5th grade will join their

younger siblings in the front pickup area.

Parent Pick-up (by vehicle): Please have your student's name and iDismiss Tag # visible for our check-in staff.

Parent Walk-Up (Pick-up): Parents may walk to the front walkway on the side of building to pick up their students. Please have your student's name and iDismiss Tag with number available to expedite reuniting you with your student.

Change of Way Home for Students: If you need to change your child's normal dismissal routine, please call the office no later than 2:30 p.m. This is to ensure that the message reaches the teacher in time for dismissal.

FOOD: LUNCH & BIRTHDAYS

Parents are welcome to have lunch with their child. We ask that the following guidelines are followed:

- Only your child will be allowed to eat lunch with you at the parent table during their regular class lunch time. Please refrain from sitting at the classroom table.
- You are welcome to bring food for your child. Food is not allowed to be brought or shared with other students.
- Students must return to class with their teacher.
- Parents or lunch visitors are not allowed to take pictures, video, or make audio (voice) recordings of other Fernandez students during their visit.

Students are NOT allowed to share food or snacks to prevent any allergic reactions.

Students enjoy celebrating their birthdays at school. We celebrate them with a special birthday pencil and sticker when they come to the front office.

- You may send non-food items such as pencils, erasers, or stickers to celebrate birthdays.
- Store bought, pre-packaged cookies or cupcakes are permitted, to ensure that the teacher is able to pass out treats easily. Please deliver to the front office.
- Birthday party invitations should be distributed to all students, or all boys, or all girls.
- Please no flowers, balloons, treat bags, or drinks other than water.
- Reach out to your child's teacher to make sure we are keeping our students with food allergies safe.
- We will celebrate birthdays 10-15 minutes before dismissal.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Why is attendance so important?

Research shows that missing 10% of the school year (~17 days) negatively impacts a student's academic performance.

Students who don't attend school regularly will miss out on fundamental reading and math - this will start to show by 3rd grade, or sooner.

Help us reach our 95% attendance goal this year!

When should you keep your child home?

 If you child has a fever, is vomiting, has diarrhea, has an eye infection, or a communicable disease.

When can you child return to school?

- Fever free for 24 hours without using fever reducing medication.
- No longer vomiting or having diarrhea for 24 hours.
- No longer contagious or has seen a doctor and has begun taking appropriate medication or has been cleared by a doctor with a doctor's note.

What to do when your child is absent?

- Contact your child's teacher via email, Class Dojo, or call the school.
- If your child is sick, feel free to contact our school nurse.
- Send a doctor or parent's note when your child returns to school.

NISD STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Behavior & Discipline

All students are expected to abide by the Northside Independent School District Student Code of Conduct. One of the most important requirements of a good learning environment is appropriate behavior of each student. We use a progressive system of consequences that can begin with verbal reminders to the student or communication with parents for minor infractions.

Student Dress & Grooming

- Shorts of mid-thigh length may be worn at all school levels.
- Appropriate footwear must be worn; footwear which has toes reinforced with steel, hard plastics or similar materials are specifically prohibited.
 Please keep in mind that students have recess daily
 - Please keep in mind that students have recess daily and attend PE every other day. Rubber soled shoes or tennis shoes are the safest shoes for your student to wear. Student shoes or clothing shall not excuse participation in school activities.
- Any clothes that are suggestive or indecent or which cause a distraction will be prohibited. Specifically, oversized clothing, tank tops, muscle shirts, halter/crop tops, spaghetti straps, exposed backs or midriffs, and seethrough garments are prohibited.
 - If students are dress inappropriately we will contact their parent and/or provide alternate clothing.
- Hair must be neat and clean. Unconventional hair styles that distract from teaching and learning will be prohibited.
 - This includes unnatural dye-colored hair or hairstyles; regardless of gender.

HB 1481 LEGISLATIVE UPDATES: PERSONAL COMMUNICATION DEVICES

All personal communication devices must be kept in backpacks and/or out of sight throughout the instructional day and placed in a designated area (cubbies). This is consistent with our current practice but now includes all communication devices. Personal communication devices include, but not limited to, cell phones, SMART watches, personal tablets, Air Pods and other technology devices.

Texas House Bill 1481, also known as the "Phone-Free Classrooms" bill, mandates that all public school districts and open-enrollment charter schools in Texas must implement policies prohibiting students from using personal communication devices, including cell phones, smartwatches, and other devices, during the school day.
