AP: What is it?

- ☐ AP courses expose students to college rigor, and allow them to earn college credit by passing an AP exam (score 3 or higher).
- \square Students pay for AP exams in the Fall per College Board Deadlines.
- Exams paid for after the registration deadline, will incur a College Board late order fee of \$40 per exam in addition to the exam fee.
- ☐ College Board Unused/canceled exam fee:
 - \$40 fee-Student drops an AP course after ordering AP exam
 - \$40 fee-Student does not show up/does not take the AP exam that was ordered
- ☐ Students take the AP exams in early May, and get the scores in early July.

OnRamps: Teacher Qualifications

- Certified high school teacher and a college professor
- Not required to have a Master's Degree
- Complete extensive OnRamps trainings year-round

OnRamps: What is it?

- Students earn college credit from UT Austin.
- Students engage with high-quality content and build digital literacy skills using the same tools as UT students.
- Students earn TWO grades (high school and college). These grades do NOT have to match.
- Students will choose towards the end of the school year if they want to accept the college credit or not.



Dual Credit: Teacher Qualifications

- Certified high school teachers
- Hold a Master's Degree
- Hired by Alamo Community
 College District (ACCD) as
 adjunct instructors
- Have at least 18 graduate hours in the content area

Dual Credit: What is it?

- Dual Credit allows students to earn both high school and college credit simultaneously at their high school.
- College credit is awarded as long as the student earns a
 70 or higher each semester.
- Awarding of college credit comes from a local community college (Northwest Vista College - ACCD).
- Can can take up to 14 courses or earn up 42 hours of college credit
- ☐ Majority of courses available to Junior & Senior students

Dual Credit: STEPS

- STEP 1: ApplyTexas online application; students can do this at school with Mrs. Kohn; DUE March 22nd
- STEP 2: Go FAARR & Test Prep Modules, Dual Credit Orientation, & Parent Consent Form – must be completed before students take the TSI; DUE APRIL 22nd
- STEP 3: TSI exam computer-based exam that determines eligibility to take college level courses Testing dates and deadline TBA



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
