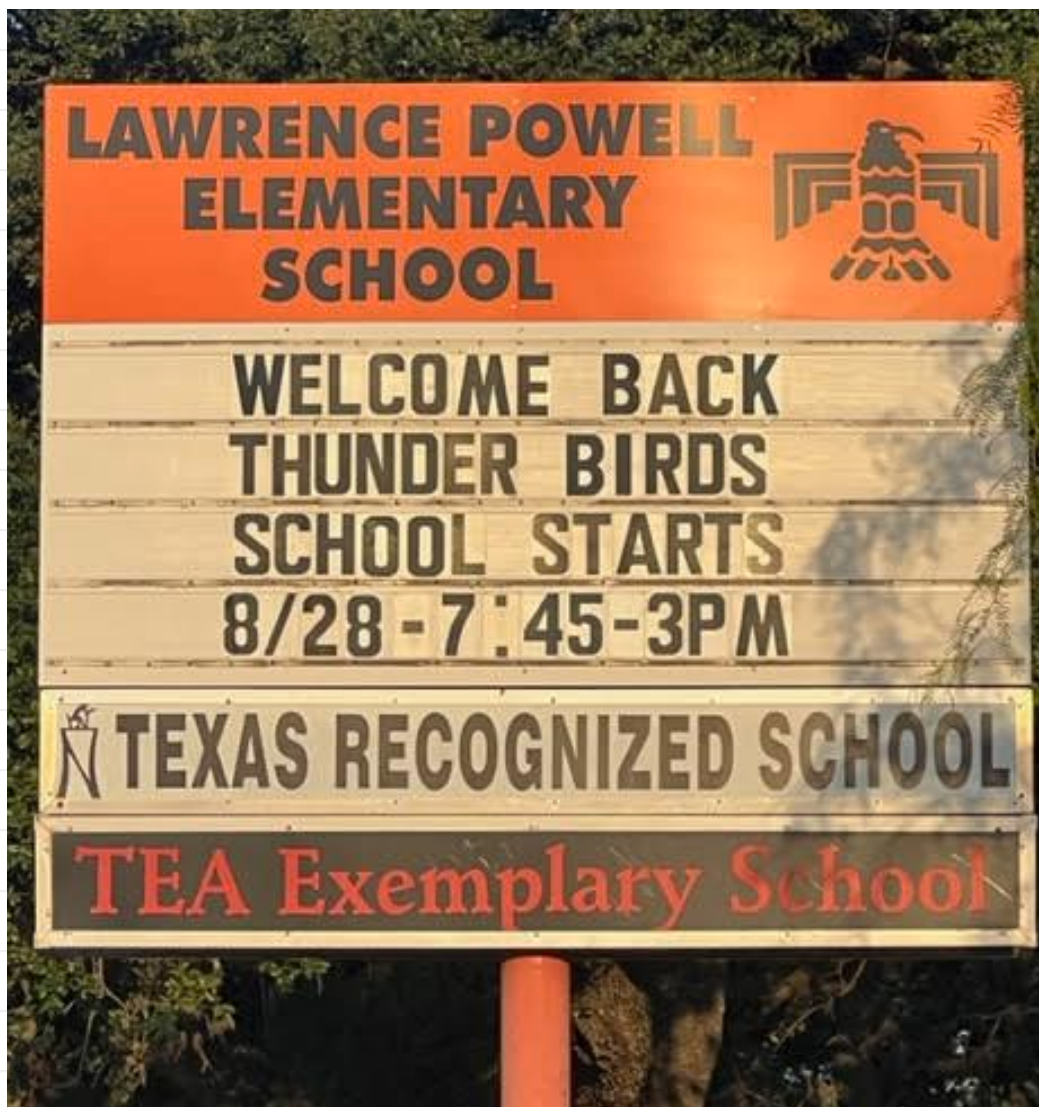

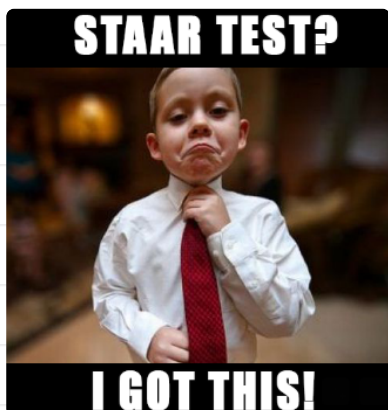
## Powell's Mission & Vision & Core Beliefs

#### **STAAR Testing**

Testing season is upon us. The following three weeks, we will have a closed campus on select testing days, as there are secure areas and protocols that are required to follow as a campus. We will be asking for support in not having visitors for lunch or parent volunteers on the following dates for STAAR.

Tuesday, April 16 (Reading and Language Arts)

Tuesday, April 23rd (Science- 5th Grade)

Tuesday, April 30th (Math)

We ask for all of our parents support with the following:

- \* A good night sleep. Every 3rd-5th grade student needs to go to bed by 8 pm.
- \*Students cannot be checked out early.
- \*If there should be an urgent situation, please contact the front office.
- \*If a student is absent, they will make up the test when they return based on the state testing window.

#### **24-25 Data Validation:**

On March 18th, data validation for the 24-25 school year began. Parents should have received an email to log into Home Access Center (HAC) and complete your student's data validation for next year.

At this time, depending on the number of students who are registered, will determine how many teachers we have allocated for each grade level. If you are still unsure if your child will be attending Blattman, please secure your child's spot NOW. If you need to update it after you complete the validation process, please call the front office.

We know that sometimes parents wish to share characteristics or attributes that you feel your child needs in a teacher or some characteristics that you know would not bring the best out in your child. I would encourage parents to share that information regarding requests for the upcoming school year. Teacher attribute requests will be accepted up until **May 1st, 2024**. 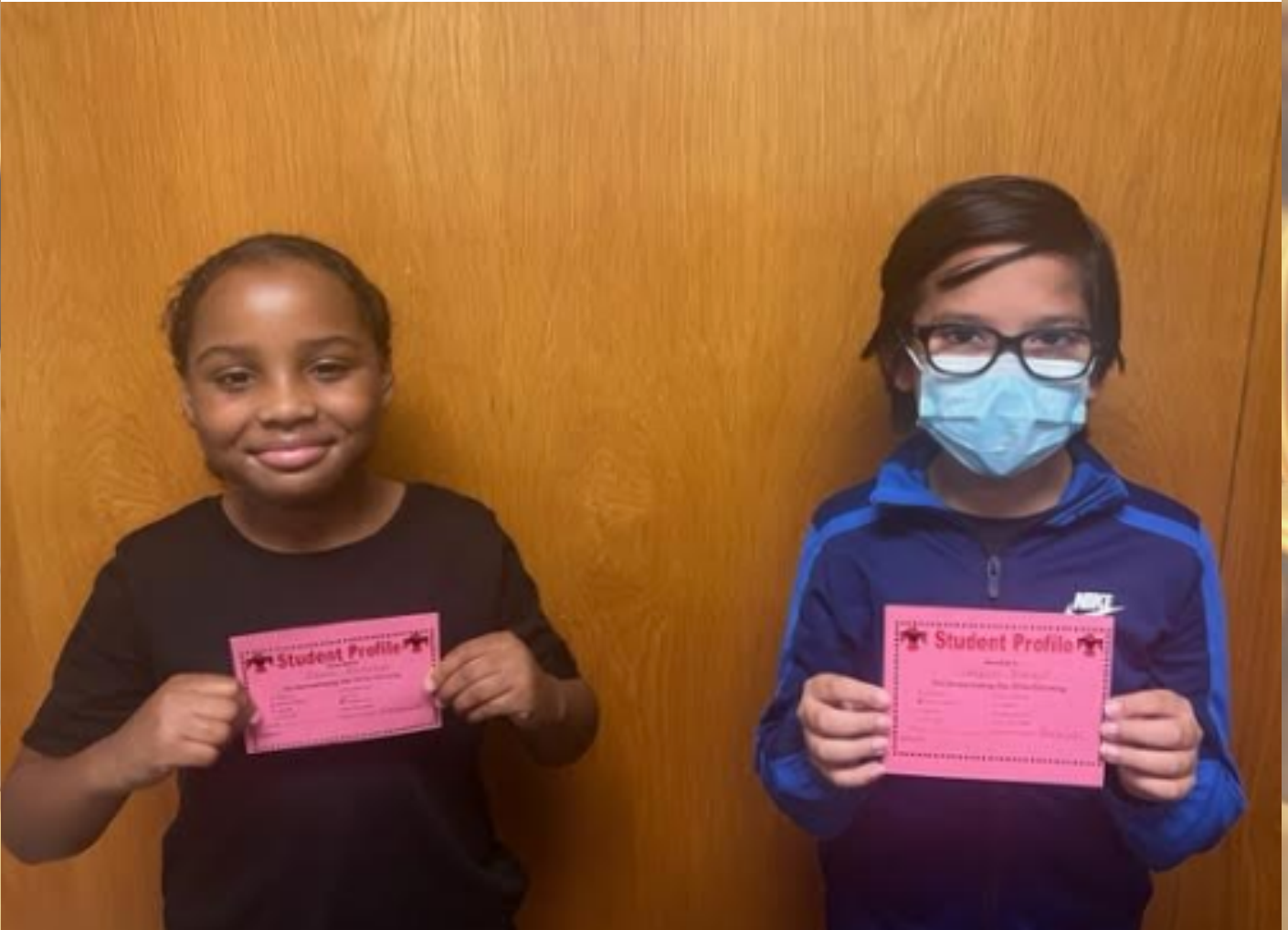

Parents and Families,

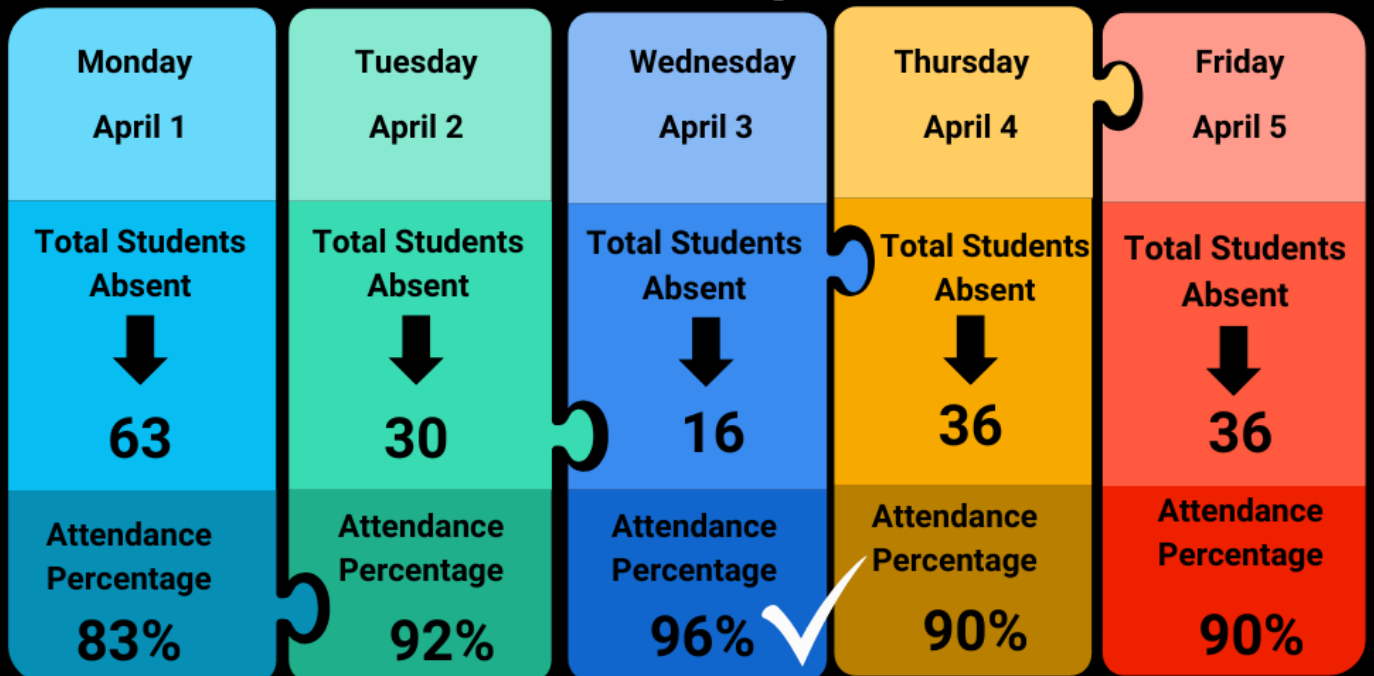
As we continue to focus on academic and social emotional growth, we need our Powell families to support our teachers by having their child at school. When students miss 2 days of school per month or 18 days of the year, it can impact a student's learning where learning gaps can occur from one grade level to the next. For example, 41% of Kinder students who miss 18 days or more a year are at risk of not reading on grade level. We appreciate your support with having your child at school every day.

Our current attendance rate for the year is at 91.38%, which is below our campus goal of 93%.

This past week our attendance was with the following: Monday- 76%; Tuesday- 92%; Wednesday- 89%; Thursday- 93% and Friday- 92%. The weekly average was 88.4%. Your support with attendance makes a HUGE difference with our teachers and helps our Thunderbirds with their learning. Let's finish these next few weeks off strong!

As we continue to actively monitor our campus safety and security plan, we will continue to ask all of our parents to come through the front office after 7:40 am. We close the side gate at 7:40 am and will not allow parents to drop off their child at their class after 7:40 am. Our campus buildings, (Pods), are locked after 7:45 am. If you should come for lunch, we will be asking you to check in at the front office to get a visitor's badge. Please continue to bring your Driver's License or a valid picture ID. We appreciate your help and support in making sure our campus is safe and secure.

## STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

### COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

### HOLD

"In Your Room or Area. Clear the Halls."

Students are trained to:

- Clear the hallways and remain in their room or area until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Close and lock the door
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual



### SECURE

"Get Inside, Lock outside doors"

Students are trained to:

- Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock outside doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual



### LOCKDOWN

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

Students are trained to:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend



### EVACUATE

"To a Location"

Students are trained to:

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone
- Follow instructions

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to take anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- Account for students and adults



### SHELTER

"State Hazard and Safety Strategy"

Hazards might include:

- Tornado
- Hail
- Earthquake
- Tsunami

Safety Strategies might include:

- Evacuate to shelter area
- Seal the room
- Drop, cover and hold
- Get to high ground

Students are trained in:

- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies

Adults and staff are trained in:

- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies
- Accounting for students and adults



## STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL PARENT GUIDANCE

### SECURE

"Get Inside, Lock outside doors"

Secure was formerly called Modified Lockdown, and the actions are the same. It is called when there's something dangerous outside of the building. Students and staff are brought into the building and the outside doors will be locked. The school might display the Building is Secured poster on entry doors or nearby windows. Inside, it will be business as usual.

SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A SECURE EVENT?

Probably not. Every effort is made to conduct classes as normal during a secure event. Additionally, parents may be asked to stay outside during a Secure event.

WHAT IF PARENTS NEED TO PICK UP THEIR STUDENT?

Depending on the situation, it may not be safe to release the student.

As the situation evolves, Secure might change to a Monitored Entry and/or Controlled Release.

WHAT IF PARENTS NEED TO PICK UP WHEN A SCHOOL GOES INTO SECURE?

When a Secure condition is brief or the hazard is non-violent, like a wild animal on the playground, there may not be a need to notify parents while the Secure is in place.

With longer or more dangerous events, the school should notify parents that the school has increased their security.

### LOCKDOWN

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

A Lockdown is called when there is something dangerous inside of the building. Students and staff are trained to enter or remain in a room that can be locked, and maintain silence.

A Lockdown is only initiated when there is an active threat inside or very close to the building.



### SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A LOCKDOWN?

The natural inclination for parents is to go to the school during a Lockdown. Understandable, but perhaps problematic. If there is a threat inside the building, law enforcement will be responding. It is unlikely that parents will be granted access to the building or even the campus. If parents are already in the school, they will be instructed to Lockdown as well.

### SHOULD PARENTS TEXT THEIR STUDENTS?

The school recognizes the importance of communication between parents and students during a Lockdown event. Parents should be aware though, during the initial period of a Lockdown, it may not be safe for students to text their parents. As the situation resolves, students may be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification.

### WHAT ABOUT UNANNOUNCED DRILLS?

The school may conduct unannounced drills, however it is highly discouraged to conduct one without announcing that it is a drill. That's called an unannounced drill and can cause undue concern and stress.

Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial announcement.

A drill is used to create the "muscle memory" associated with a practiced action. There is no simulation of an event, simply performing the action.

## AM & PM Drop Off & Pick Up Procedures

In the morning, our campus will open at 7am. The gate between the front office and 5th grade will be open with a staff member monitoring it. When students enter into the campus, they can have a choice between waiting for their class building to open at 7:15 am by the "old black top" or go to get breakfast in the cafeteria. When the grade level buildings open at 7:15 am, students may then go to their classroom hallway and wait by their classroom door. Students who eating breakfast will need to leave the cafeteria no later than 7:35 to get their classroom.

### Morning Parent Drop Off:

If parents would like to drop off their student at their classroom, please do between 7:15-7:40 am. We ask all parents to exit the classroom buildings by 7:40 am so teachers can start their day at 7:45 am. We appreciate your support.

We also ask parents to leave through the front office building after 7:40 am. Please do not leave through the gates after 7:40 am so we can ensure the gates are closed and secure. At times, parents may leave through a gate and the gate may not close all the way, which may leave a gate unsecured. For the safety and security of the campus, please support our efforts and leave through the front office. We appreciate you help and support.



## Afternoon Parent Pick Up: (Read 23-24 Safety First Below)

Parents, dismissal will start at 3 pm. If you are picking up your child from the teacher, please follow these procedures for the safety of our students.

- All Pre-K and Kinder Parents, we will be dismissing our PK/Kinder students from the cafeteria. If you are a walk up parent, please go to the "double doors" outside the cafeteria to pick up your child. If you are a car pick up parent, please let a staff member know that you are needing a Pre-K/Kinder student.
- If you are in the pick up line and in your vehicle, please do not get out of your car. A staff member will help get your child and bring them to you.
- Make sure you have your "Car Pick Up" sign on your dashboard.
- If you are picking up your child from teacher (Parent Walk Up), please stay behind the "Duct Tape Line" until your child's class has arrived at their designated grade level area.


